My internship experience at GSK was colourful. Every month brought with it different milestones and tasks, making work interesting. My main role as a Technical Intern was to support my supervisor in ensuring the technical robustness of our products, especially at the pre-launch stage. This involved looking at manufacturing documents, stability data and risk assessment documents to capture technical risks, as well as helping to diagnose the root causes of problems that were reported at the manufacturing sites.

Apart from this, my supervisor and I took part in ad-hoc projects to assist the other business functions. I was involved in a campus outreach event where I talked to students about internship and work opportunities, and life at GSK.
