

CITATION FOR MR LEE TZU YANG

OUTSTANDING SERVICE AWARD

Mr Lee Tzu Yang is widely regarded as one of Singapore's foremost industry leaders, a cherished patron of the arts, and a highly respected friend and advisor to Singapore and NUS.

Mr Lee graduated from the London School of Economics and Political Science in 1976, and joined Shell in 1979. He retired as Chairman of Shell Companies in Singapore at the end of October 2014 after 35 years of service in operational, commercial and strategy functions across a range of markets.

Mr Lee was a member of the NUS Council, and later the NUS Board of Trustees, from 2004 to 2010. He was also a board member of the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy from 2008 to 2010, and a member of the advisory committee from 2002 to 2014 to the University's Master of Science in Environmental Management — NUS' first multifaculty programme.

Mr Lee has served as Chairman of the Board of the Middle East Institute at NUS since its establishment in 2007. As Chairman, he has guided the work of the Institute, and

supported its research and outreach work in areas of key economic and political

interest to Singapore as the only institute in Southeast Asia focused on the Middle East

region.

A gentleman of quiet temperament and wise counsel, Mr Lee was appointed Chairman

of the Founders' Memorial Committee in 2015. He heads a 15-member committee

tasked with gathering views from the public, and to conceptualise a memorial to honour

and remember the values and ideals of Singapore's founding generation of leaders.

We stand in awe of the responsibility he shoulders, and yet are deeply comforted in his

steadfast leadership.

Throughout his stellar career, and even after retirement from Shell, Mr Lee continues to

be closely involved in organisations that have a significant impact on the development

of Singapore, and the daily lives of Singaporeans. He is a member of the Council of

Presidential Advisers, the Legal Service Commission of Singapore, and the advisory

board of the Centre for Liveable Cities. He chairs the board of The Esplanade, and is

chairman of the Casino Regulatory Authority. Mr Lee is also a Justice of the Peace and

a member of the Board of Visiting Justices. He had previously headed the Arts and

Culture Strategic Review for Singapore, and was the founding chairman of the School

of the Arts.

For his public service contributions to Singapore, Mr Lee was awarded the Bintang

Bakti Masyarakat or Public Service Star, in 2005, and the Pingat Jasa Gemilang or

Meritorious Service Medal, in 2014.
