5	Accommodation	Housing under TU Darmstadt's organisational package is included in the fee. NUS students must select the organisational package to be eligible for the programme.
6	Application Procedure at NUS	Please apply through the NUS Education Records System - Global Education (EduRec-GE) first if you want to do course mapping and apply for financial aid/loans. Applying through EduRec-GE will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while overseas.  GRO will subsequently review your application and offer you the programme. You will only be nominated for the programme once you have accepted the offer. GRO will inform you to proceed with the online application once you have been nominated.  With an official application through EduRec-GE, you are covered by the NUS Travel Blanket Insurance. You will also be able to request supporting letters for visa application and NS deferment (for NSmen).  You should also apply to the host university concurrently once you have applied to NUS EduRec-GE.
7	Application Procedure at Host University	When nominated you can complete the <u>Online Application</u> by providing all documents, including the <u>Project Choice Form</u> . You can find research projects in our <u>Project Database</u> . Alternatively, you can contact us <u>IREP</u> to suggest your own project, or to inform us about your interested fields of research and we will contact research groups about projects for you.  Note: The <u>Application Guideline</u> (opens in new tab) is a supporting document, designed to help you with filling out the application.
8	Confirmation of participation	Once TU Darmstadt has received the nomination from GRO, as well as your online application, they will forward all documents to the corresponding IREP project supervisor for approval. In case your application gets accepted, they will provide you with the admission documents.



		Please keep in mind: A nomination by GRO does not guarantee a research placement. The final acceptance into IREP always depends on the decision of the respective project supervisor.
9	Course Mapping	All course mapping requests are subject to approval by the faculties/departments.
		If you are interested in obtaining credits for your course, you can start the course mapping process via EduRec-GE after you have accepted the programme offer. Click <a href="here">here</a> for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping.  Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 units for involvement in the summer programme. Beyond 12 units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. Please read the information on the Office of the University Registrar's website for details.
10	Transcript	Please provide a valid, personal mailing address in the online registration portal so the host can send your transcript to you after the summer programme.
		Please <b>do not</b> request that your transcript be mailed to the NUS Global Relations Office (GRO). GRO is not responsible for missing transcripts.

11	Visa Application	Holders of a Singapore passport do not require a visa for visits to Germany lasting up to 90 days. For other nationalities, please enquire with the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany.  If you need a visa to enter Germany, please start early as your visa application may take up to 2 months.
