		Remaining weeks	Participants will study under the guidance of their respective laboratories after developing a research proposal and will gain first-hand experience in the academic research process. Midterm presentation, Japanese cultural experience events
		Final day	Participants will make a presentation summarizing their research experience and the findings of their research project, followed by the Certificate of Completion Award Ceremony
5	Eligibility Requirements	 NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply, please see GRO website for details. UTSIP's requirements: Participants must be in their undergraduate program at an overseas college or university throughout the entire duration of UTSIP program and will not have completed their bachelor's (equivalent level) degree program. Participants who are considering matriculating to graduate level study at the Graduate School of Frontier Sciences or other graduate schools at The University of Tokyo, or elsewhere in Japan Participants are required to participate in all activities including classes, laboratory work, and special events organized by UTSIP. 	
6	Accommodation	UTSIP Kashiwa participants are to be housed in a designated accommodation by the program. They must check in one day before the program starting date and check out one day after the final day of the program. Each participant will receive housing information about one month before the program starting date. Please note that some participants may have to move to another accommodation in the midst of the program because the annual accommodation situation makes arranging one location for the entire period difficult year by year.

		3. A separate automatic reply email with the title "/UTSIP/ Your account registration successfully done." will be sent to you. This email contains your User ID, password and a URL. Please access the URL using your ID and password and upload all required documents to complete your application.	
		The application deadline is January 13 (Tuesday) 2026 at 17:00 Japan time. *Their server may become busier as the deadline approaches, so apply early.

		Please also note the following: Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 units for each Winter Programme. Course mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools.	
		A total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition.
