5	Eligibility Requirements	<p>NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply, please see GRO website for details.</p> <p>UTSIP's requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Participants must be in their undergraduate program at an overseas college or university throughout the entire duration of UTSIP program and will not have completed their bachelor's (equivalent level) degree program.• Participants who are considering matriculating to graduate level study at the Graduate School of Frontier Sciences or other graduate schools at The University of Tokyo, or elsewhere in Japan• Participants are required to participate in all activities including classes, laboratory work, and special events organized by UTSIP.								
6	Accommodation	<p>UTSIP Kashiwa participants are to be housed in a designated accommodation by the program. They must check in one day before the program starting date and check out one day after the final day of the program. Each participant will receive housing information about one month before the program starting date.</p> <p>Please note that some participants may have to move to another accommodation in the midst of the program because the annual accommodation situation makes arranging one location for the entire period difficult year by year.</p>								

7	Application Procedure	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Apply directly to the host university: https://www.ilo.k.u-tokyo.ac.jp/utsip-apply/ilo/application/form 2. An automatic reply email with the title "/UTSIP/Submission successfully done." will be sent to the email address you entered above. Please follow the instructions and click the URL in the email to confirm your email address. 3. A separate automatic reply email with the title "/UTSIP/ Your account registration successfully done." will be sent to you. This email contains your User ID, password and a URL. Please access the URL using your ID and password and upload all required documents to complete your application. <p>The application deadline is January 13 (Tuesday) 2026 at 17:00 Japan time. *Their server may become busier as the deadline approaches, so apply early.</p> <p>If you do not receive the email after submitting the Application page, please consider the following possible reasons.:</p> <p>The email address you entered contains a mistake. The automatic reply email was delivered to your spam/junk folder. The automatic reply email was blocked as spam and wasn't delivered (this issue is common among Gmail users). Write to NUS GRO (global@nus.edu.sg) providing the host university name and programme start and end date for programme set-up in NUS Education Records System (EduRec). 5. Proceed to apply in EduRec once the programme has been set up. 6. Final acceptance to the summer research programme is decided by the respective host universities.
8	Course Mapping	<p>Students interested in transferring units can start the course mapping process after applying and accepting the offer for the programme in EduRec. Course mapping requests are subjected to approval from the Faculties. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping.</p> <p>Please also note the following: Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 units for each Winter Programme. Course mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools.</p> <p>A total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition.</p>

9	Visa Application	<p>It is the student's responsibility to ensure they obtain a valid visa (if required) before making any travel arrangements for their programme. Students are encouraged to prepare and apply for a visa as early as possible (if required), as obtaining a visa can be time-consuming.</p> <p>If you require a visa to visit Japan, please apply via the Embassy of Japan in Singapore website.</p>

11	Student Insurance	<p>NUS Student Travel Insurance is provided for your participation in this programme. Should you require a certificate of insurance, you may request it from the insurer directly following the instructions detailed in: https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/. (Log in using your NUSNET ID and password.)</p> <p>The Graduate School of Frontier Sciences (GSFS) will provide a health insurance program for all participants which is effective throughout the entire duration of the UTSIP program.</p> <p>Health insurance plan GSFS provides:</p> <table><tr><td>Death or Physical Disability benefits</td><td>1 million yen</td></tr><tr><td>Medical benefits</td><td>1 million yen</td></tr><tr><td>Liability (when other parties are injured)</td><td>100 million yen</td></tr></table> <p>When you receive medical treatment for injuries caused by accidents or diseases developed while attending UTSIP, all medical treatment expenses up to 1 million yen, in principle, shall be paid by the insurance company.
