7	Application Procedure at NUS	 Please apply through the NUS Education Records System - Global Education (EduRec) first if you want to do module mapping and apply for financial aid/loans. Applying through EduRec will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while overseas. With an official application through EduRec, you are covered by the NUS Travel Blanket Insurance. Besides, GRO can also provide you with supporting letters for visa application. You should also apply to EduRec first and GRO will nominate students who have accepted the offer on EduRec to Global Learning at Cornell University. After which, Global Learning will contact you directly on the summer research application and help set up interviews with faculty mentors.

8	Application Procedure at Host University	Please apply on EduRec and accept the offer to be nominated for the Cornell Summer Research Internships. The application deadline is <u>15 March 2025.</u>
9	Confirmation of participation	Note that this is a competitive programme, and admission is not guaranteed.To confirm your participation in this Programme, you must accept the EduRecoffer and the host university's offer.
10	Course Mapping	All course mapping requests are subject to approval by the faculties/departments.Important: When applying for Short Term Programmes, make sure to choose only in-person courses or programmes, as these are the only ones eligible for Course Mapping. Following this guidance will help prevent any issues with your NUS home faculty or school during Course Mapping.If you are interested in obtaining credits for your course, you can start the course mapping process via EduRec after you have accepted the programme offer.Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 units for involvement in the summer programme. Beyond 12 units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university.
