		The programme fee includes registration, tuition, use of all sports and recreational facilities (including windsurfing lessons), all planned excursions. More details can be found here . A limited number of partial scholarships ranging from € 1,000 to € 3,000 are available for the European Studies section of the univie summer school. The scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic excellence and financial need. In order to receive a scholarship, students must demonstrate their financial need by describing their financial situation and submitting related documents. The application deadline for scholarship applications is 28 February 2026. Applications must have reached the office of the univie summer school by this date. PROGRAMME DETAILS

4 Academic Content

The univie summer school lasts for four weeks and consists of two two-week sessions.

12 European Studies courses, the Arbitration Academy course, and German Languages courses on four levels are offered:

- European Studies courses last two weeks (4 ECTS each)
- The Austrian Arbitration Academy course lasts two weeks (8 ECTS)
- German language courses last four weeks (6 ECTS each)

In the course of the four-week programme, **students are required to attend courses amounting to 10 ECTS credits**, with the exception that the Austrian Arbitration Academy can be attended as an independent programme.

In order to meet this requirement, one of the following options is possible:

- 1. Three European Studies courses, or
- 2. The Austrian Arbitration Academy course plus one European Studies course, or
- 3. One German course plus one European Studies course

Students may also enrol in or audit additional courses. The maximum number of courses students may attend during the summer programme is four. (This includes German courses and/or courses taken for audit.)

5 Eligibility Requirements

NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply, please see <u>GRO website</u> for details. Applications and selections are subject to review by the host university.

Host university's requirements are as follows:

- At least 18 years old
- Have completed two years of studies at NUS
- In attendance for the whole period of the univie summer school
- Take part in the required number of courses
- Have an adequate command of the English language

Applicants should also note that certain courses may have prerequisites.
