4	Academic Content	ISIBM comprises of two core modules that cover Business Communication, International Business, Service Management and Entrepreneurship.			
		Total program consists of 78 classroom hours, equivalent to 6.0 North American credit hours of course work.			
		Students will receive a Certificate of Completion and Grade Letter upon successful completion of the programme.			
		(Please note: Students have to complete the course mapping process in NUS to seek approval for awarding of units. Refer to Item 8 for more details.)			
		Module 1: Business Communication (Equivalent of 39 lecture hours + academic projects)			
		Business Communications will focus on the development and enhancement of skills in written/oral business communication, non-verbal communication, and cross-cultural communication. Students will learn how to develop efficient use of verbal and non-verbal skills in business situations and be able to use language to convey specific messages to intended audiences.			
		Module 2: Entrepreneurship, Service Management and International Business (Equivalent of 39 lecture hours + academic projects)			
		This course is based on a program that has earned UVic several international awards. It aims to develop a fundamental understanding of the skills and tools necessary to succeed in today's global marketplace. We begin with issues relating to starting a business (entrepreneurship), continue with topics around ensuring success (service management) and end with issues involving growing the business (international business). Whether you plan to start your own business one day or work in a large multinational corporation, this course provides you with the knowledge to enhance your opportunities for success.			
5	Eligibility Requirements	NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply, please see GRO website for details.			
6	Accommodation	Students will stay in campus residences – the Commonwealth Village clusters. Students have a private bedroom and share a kitchen, living room, dining room and washrooms with 3 other students. • This is a great opportunity for ISIBM students to meet other UVic locals and international students. The campus is a 10 minute walk from the beach, local supermarkets and entertainment venues. Libraries, galleries, bus exchange, movie theatre and athletics and recreation centers with swimming pools are located on campus.			
		 UVic has always provided the best campus experience for all students – cafeterias, restaurants, medical and dental clinics, pharmacy, hair salon, travel agency, printing and photocopy services as well as free wireless internet are around campus. Students will have a meal card to use around campus in restaurants, cafes and student cafeterias.

8	Course Mapping	 You can start the course mapping process after you apply in EduRec and accept the offer for the programme. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping. Also note the following: Maximum of 2 courses (up to 10 units) can be mapped per summer / resea programme during Special Term (May – August). Maximum of 1 course (up to 5 units) can be mapped per winter / research programme during year-end vacation (December – January). Total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and resear programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional units mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees.
