		your participation in this programme.				
		Only upon acceptance of the EduRec offer can you proceed with course mapping and application for financial aids.				
		Applying on EduRec will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while you are overseas. With an official application through EduRec, you will also be able to request GRO for supporting letters for visa application and NS deferment (for NSmen).

8	Course Mapping	Students interested in transferring units can start the course mapping process after applying and accepting the offer for the programme in EduRec. Course mapping request is subjected to approval from the Faculties. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping.

		Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme and				
		up to a maximum of 5 units for each Winter Programme. Course mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools.				
		A total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional units mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees. For details, visit the Office of the University Registrar's website.				
9	Transcript	Please provide a valid, personal mailing address to the host university so that the host can send your transcript to you directly after the programme. If the host issues an electronic transcript, please provide your personal NUS email address to receive the transcript.
