**COVID-19 related updates:**

Due to the COVID-19 situation, Charles University in Prague has announced that they are offering their summer courses in 2021 online.

Students may apply for module mapping and transfer a maximum of eight (8) MCs (this is applicable only to electronic summer programmes 2021). Please note that some Schools or Faculties (including the School of Computing) will not approve module mapping for remote or online courses. Please check with your home School or Faculty Dean’s Office to determine if module mapping can be approved for remote/online courses before applying to the partner university.
