## **ESTIMATED COST OF PARTICIPATION**

1 | Programme Fee

NUS will nominate up to 6 students to participate in the summer university. The summer university fee is €1,400 and covers the following:

- Housing while attending the Summer University
- Unlimited public transportation (bus, subway, underground) within the greater Stuttgart area
- Excursions (bus, train, lunch, guided tours, entrance fees; a EUR 20 registration fee is additional)
- Program administrative costs

The following are not covered in the summer university fee:

- Tuition at your university
- Any program fees your home university charges to cover its costs
- Transportation to Stuttgart
- Transportation to the university before registration
- Breakfast (for students not housed with host families)
- Lunch and dinner
- Medical/accident insurance
- Textbooks for German language class (approx. EUR 25)
- Personal expenses

8	Application Procedure at Host University	To apply for this program, you will need to complete and sign the <u>application</u> form and have the form endorsed by GRO before emailing the completed application form to Babette Endrulat-Göhler ( <u>babette.endrulat-goehler@ia.uni-stuttgart.de</u> ) International Office of the University of Stuttgart by <u>8 March 2025</u> .	
9	Confirmation of participation	To confirm your participation in this Programme, you must accept both the EduRec offer and the host university's offer to confirm your participation in this programme.	
10	Course Mapping	All course mapping requests are subject to approval by the faculties/departments.	
		If you are interested in obtaining credits for your course, you can start the course mapping process via EduRec-GE after you have accepted the programme offer.	
		Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 units for involvement in the summer programme. Beyond 12 units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to	



		the host university. Please read the information on the Office of the University Registrar's website for details.
11	Transcript	Please provide a valid, personal mailing address in the online registration portal so the host can send your transcript to you after the summer programme.  Please <u>do not</u> request that your transcript be mailed to the NUS Global Relations Office (GRO). GRO is not responsible for missing transcripts.

12	Visa Application	Holders of a Singapore passport do not require a visa for visits to Germany lasting up to 90 days. For other nationalities, please enquire with the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany in Singapore for visa requirements.	
		If you need a visa to enter Germany, please start early, as your visa application may take up to 2 months.	
13	Travel Advisories	Visit the MFA website for travel advisories from the Singapore government in various countries.
