Students may apply for module mapping and transfer a maximum of eight (8) MCs (this is applicable only to electronic summer programmes 2021). Please note that some Schools or Faculties (including School of Computing) will not approve module mapping for remote or online courses. Please check with your home School or Faculty Dean's Office to determine if module mapping can be approved for remote/online courses before applying to the partner university.

4	Academic Content	<p>The four-week International Summer University Programme consists of three components:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Engineering Courses and Workshops The various engineering courses offer students the opportunity to gain insights into Mechanical Engineering or Electrical Engineering through a combination of lectures, interactive workshops and group presentations. ○ Virtual Excursions to German companies (such as): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Continental AG – German automotive manufacturing company ▪ Merck KGaA – German research company in chemistry and pharmacy located in Darmstadt 2. Intensive German Language Courses Students will gain German speaking, writing, reading and listening skills for every day communication. This course is offered at a beginner's level for students with no previous knowledge as well as on intermediate and advanced levels for students that have taken German classes at home. A placement test will assess the level of the student's knowledge. 3. Cross-Cultural Competencies Training for Engineers This seminar will train non-German students in intercultural skills to help them successfully navigate in an intercultural working and learning environment in Germany. It will also introduce students to practical techniques, skills and knowledge surrounding themes of living, studying and working in Germany. <p style="text-align: center;">Social and Cultural Programmes</p> <p>Expand your study abroad experience by virtually attending our social and cultural activities in and around the Rhein-Main Hessen region.</p> <p>For further information please see their poster.</p> <p>All Engineering courses as well as the Cross-Cultural Competencies Training for Engineers will be held in English.</p> <p>Be sure to visit their Instagram Account to see what students were doing during their Summer programme in the past years.</p>

Students studying similar subjects within the field of Engineering and Sciences are however also welcome to apply.</p> <p>NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply, please see GRO website for details.</p>
7	Application Procedure at NUS	<p>Please apply through NUS Education Records System - Global Education (EduRec-GE) first if you want to do module mapping.</p> <p>You should also apply to the host university concurrently once you have submitted an application in NUS Edu-Rec.</p>
8	Application Procedure at Host University	<p>Please apply through EduRec for the ISU at TU Darmstadt. NUS will nominate applicants to TU Darmstadt.</p> <p>Please keep in mind: Nomination by the home university does not guarantee a placement in the programme.</p> <p>TU Darmstadt will confirm a successful nomination via email. Make sure to check your emails regularly.</p> <p>Your next steps will then be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Register with TU Darmstadt • Pay the Programme Fee • Receive a Letter of Acceptance
9	Confirmation of participation	<p>You will be informed by the host via email about possible financial support together with the information on your acceptance or rejection.</p> <p>You have to accept EduRec-GE offer as well as the host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme.</p> <p>Please read the cancellation policy of this programme before accepting and paying for the programme.</p>
