6	Accommodation	<p>Students are responsible for organizing their accommodation. The housing costs are not included in the programme fee.</p> <p>UniTartu Summer School participants can stay at the student dormitory in Tartu Downtown Hostel (University of Tartu Student Dormitory), which offers apartment-style accommodation. Each apartment contains three rooms, and rooms are allocated by gender.</p> <p>Shared rooms (21,50 EUR/per night) or single rooms (38 EUR/per night) are available, with shared kitchen and bathroom facilities. The hostel is located within walking distance of the city centre, with grocery stores nearby and excellent bus connections. Free Wi-Fi is provided. The hostel has a 24-hour reception. Please note that breakfast is not included. For a short-term stays, bedding is provided by the Hostel.</p> <p>Visit the Tartu Downtown Hostel website for detailed information.</p> <p>Accommodation bookings for the dormitory must be made exclusively through the accommodation registration form, which will be sent to participants via email upon acceptance to the programme.</p> <p>Please note that rooms are limited, so early registration is recommended.</p> <p>Please visit their website for important to know information prior to your arrival: https://ut.ee/en/content/arrival-and-housing</p>

You must accept both <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The EduRec offer; and • The host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme. 3. You may proceed with course mapping and applying for financial aid after accepting the offer on EduRec. <p>We require all NUS students going on NUS endorsed summer programmes to apply via EduRec. Besides allowing you to submit course mapping and apply for financial aid, this allows NUS to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while you are overseas. Additionally, NUS can also provide</p>

		<p>supporting letters for visa application and NS deferment (for NSmen).</p> <p>Please read the application guide before applying for the programme with NUS.</p> <p><u>UniTartu Application</u></p> <p>UniTartu application period runs from 20 March to 20 April.</p> <p>To apply, you should follow the UniTartu’s application procedure and requirements, which are available here: https://ut.ee/en/content/general-application-procedure-and-requirements.</p> <p>As part of the application, you will need to prepare the required documents and items, including an application fee of EUR 25, a motivation letter, your current academic transcript, and a copy of your passport.</p> <p>UniTartu will release the application results by the end of April.</p>
8	Course Mapping	<p>Students interested in transferring units can start the course mapping process after applying and accepting the offer for the programme in EduRec. Course mapping requests are subject to approval from the Faculties. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping.</p> <p>Please also note that students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 units for each Winter Programme.</p> <p>A total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional units mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees. For details, visit the Office of the University Registrar's website.</p>
