		<p>Should you decide to attend two consecutive sessions, the housing fees are €1,272 (maximum 26 nights). You may remain on campus for the weekend between the sessions without charge, although you may be required to change room.</p> <p>On-campus rooms in the Student Residence will be in single rooms with en-suite bathroom and kitchenette.</p> <p>Participants of the HEC x EHL program will be able to book their 6-night stay on the HEC campus (Monday - Sunday) according to the same schedule. The housing fees for these 6 nights are €320. Details will be sent on how to book the week at EHL will be shared with participants after they have confirmed their place.</p> <p>EHL 2026 the cost for 5 nights (Sunday - Friday) including breakfast is CHF 460. To facilitate your travel arrangements, an additional night (Friday - Saturday) can also be booked for CHF 77 without breakfast.</p> <p>Participants of the HEC x TUM program that is being held at TUM Campus Heilbronn will be sent details on how to book their housing for the two weeks in Germany after confirming their place.</p> <p>In 2026 TUM will generously cover your entire stay at the partner hotel from Sunday 28th June to Friday 10th July. There will be no accommodation fees for you to pay [at TUM] (subject to availability and programme T&Cs).</p> <p><i>Booking a room on the HEC campus is not mandatory. Rooms are guaranteed for all summer school students who wish to take advantage of this option and who book their room before May 15th. 4	<p>Academic Content</p>	<p>SESSION 1 : June 15 – 26 OPTIONS:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Energy and Finance: Compact edition of HEC’s <i>Energy & Finance Certificate</i> (Master’s degree programs). It addresses the need for students and young professionals to develop a comprehensive, financial and strategic view of the new business models created within the energy sector largely impacted by climate issues, from the manufacturing sector to the financing industry. • Strategic Marketing and Branding: Strategic marketing and branding today are evolving rapidly, driven by powerful shifts toward sustainability, digital transformation, community engagement, and deeper consumer insights. This program provides a comprehensive understanding of these contemporary trends and equips students with essential skills to navigate and lead in this dynamic landscape. • Data Science & AI: Data Science and Artificial Intelligence are transforming the way we do business. Business models are evolving across all markets, sectors, and company sizes. This custom program equips participants with essential Data Science and AI concepts relevant to business, preparing them to contribute to data-driven transformations and collaborate effectively with Data Scientists, Data Analysts, and Data Engineers—both today and in the future. • Accounts for Finance & Strategy: Corporate finance comes with its own complex technicalities. Investment bankers emphasize, however, that practicing M&A (<i>Mergers & Acquisitions</i>) or ECM (<i>Equity Capital Markets</i>) without a solid grasp of accounting principles is unthinkable. M&A clients, for instance, need clear insights into how a proposed deal will affect the stock price and the future indebtedness capacity of their firm. Providing accurate answers to these questions relies on simulating post-transaction financial statements, enabling bankers to project the deal's impact on the company's financial outlook. • Corporate Finance: The Corporate Finance Summer Program provides students with a financial knowledge base and a ready-to-use toolbox utilized by successful professionals in the finance industry. Participants will learn key Corporate Finance principles. The teaching team includes skilled practitioners who will discuss recent financial transactions with students and share best practices from investment bankers and financial advisors. Classwork is based on real-life, international case studies, using examples of publicly listed companies. • Investment Banking and International Finance: The globalized economy creates increasing demand for professionals with well-established international corporate finance expertise. Combining fundamental learning and real-life practice, the course prepares students to undertake careers in investment banking, or corporate finance areas. Through both ready-to-use tools and practical knowledge, participants will be able to implement finance strategies and make appropriate decisions. • Luxury Management (option of Session 1 or Session 2): The luxury sector is a major aspect of the French economy and requires a specific set of managerial skills and expertise. This HEC Paris Summer Program is designed to equip participants with the knowledge to master the fundamentals of managing a luxury brand.

This comprehensive course explores the evolving boundaries of luxury, where artisanal mastery meets ethical commitment and technology. • Luxury Hospitality Management HEC-EHL (Programme involves being at HEC Paris and EHL Switzerland): EHL Hospitality Business School & HEC Paris join forces to allow you to learn from expert faculty and industry experts in the field of Luxury Hospitality Management and gain exposure to the transversal hospitality skill set. This learning experience will help you acquire theoretical knowledge in luxury hospitality brand management and hands-on training in luxury hotels and gastronomic restaurants to enable you to develop a customer-centric mindset that will help you succeed in any sector. • Luxury Management (option of Session 1 or Session 2) <i>(as above)</i> • Sustainable Finance and Investment: The <i>Sustainable Finance and Investment</i> program is about understanding how the financial industry is reinventing and innovating to redirect capital towards accelerating the transformation of the economy toward a Net Zero world. • Private Equity & LBO: This Summer Program is dedicated to developing a Private Equity mindset. It focuses on all required advanced financial tools and useful technical methodologies to optimize the structuring of a Leverage Buy Out (LBO), when a financial sponsor is in the loop. • Mergers & Acquisitions: This intensive summer program will allow participants to master the key Mergers and Acquisitions practices. Learnings will range from how to originate a deal, structure it, and complete its final execution. Following this intensive program, students will understand how an M&A deal can create value for shareholders and for firms. • Fintech: The Future of Finance: This intensive summer program will prepare participants for careers in the financial industry by equipping them to navigate the challenges of this rapidly changing world, particularly by familiarizing them with new financial technologies: AI and decentralized finance. Participants will learn how to adapt to the technological industry revolution and its consequences, with new stakeholders emerging rapidly across every continent. • Entrepreneurship and Digital Innovation HEC-TUM (program will be held at the TUM School of Management, Campus Heilbronn, Germany. The first week will be taught by TUM faculty and the second week by HEC faculty): The objective of this 2-week program is to immerse participants in two essential dimensions of digital innovation: start-up entrepreneurship and digital transformation. • Geopolitics, Globalization and Business Strategy: Understand how political, geopolitical, economic, technological, societal and climate forces (among others!) shape the global business environment - as well as how coming turbulences, like AI or climate change, may be shifting the rules of the game for business and beyond.

10	Course Mapping	<p>All course mapping requests are subject to approval by the faculties/departments.</p> <p>If you are interested in obtaining credits for your course, you can start the course mapping process via EduRec-GE after you have accepted the programme offer.</p> <p>Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 units for involvement in the summer programme. Beyond 12 units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university.
