Applicants selected for tuition waiver places will be contacted separately on the application procedure. Tuition waiver participants will be exempted from paying the programme fee which is inclusive of on-campus accommodation as well.

Also note the following: Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 units for each Winter Programme. Course mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools. A total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional units mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees.
