COVID-19 related updates:

Students' ability to travel to a country for Summer 2022 will be determined by the host country's travel policies as well as any updates to the latest travel advisory from Singapore authorities. Do factor in the need for quarantine in the host country and stay-home notice upon return to Singapore when considering the feasibility of participating in these programmes.

To be eligible for physical (on-site) summer programmes, students will need to:

- 1. complete the compulsory Overseas Travel Preparedness (OTP) module on LumiNUS;
- 2. submit a copy of their vaccination certificate and the completed Risk Acknowledgement and ConsentForm when applying on EduRec;
- 3. declare their travel plans on the NUS Overseas Travel Declaration Portal;
- 4. register with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or your country's diplomatic mission; and
- 5. attend a pre-departure briefing conducted by GRO.

Students who proceed with the physical (on-site) option acknowledge the risks associated. NUS will not be responsible for any lost deposits or expenses (including but not limited to programme/tuition fees, air tickets, housing deposits, meal plans and/or non-academic student fees) associated with travel disruptions. Students are advised not to make any financial commitments particularly those which are non-refundable until they are certain that travel is possible. Students will be fully responsible for any and all travel expenses, quarantine accommodation costs, COVID-19 tests or other costs related to the measures imposed at that point in time, both in the host country and Singapore.

7	Application Procedure	You are REQUIRED TO apply via NUS' EduRec-GE. The NUS GRO Office will forward your applications to AUR directly. AUR will then follow up with course registration and pre-departure. There is no need to submit an application via AUR website.

		Please note that you must accept <u>both</u> the EduRec offer as well as the host university offer in order to confirm your participation in this programme.
8	Module Mapping	You can start the module mapping process after you apply in EduRec and accept the offer for the programme. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for

module mapping.
Students may map up to a maximum of 10 MCs for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 MCs for each Winter Programme. Module mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools.
Students who enroll in these Programmes may request for a waiver of NUS tuition fees for the credits they wish to transfer back to NUS. This waiver applies to up to 2 Summer/Winter Programmes and up to a total of 12 MCs transferred during their course of study in NUS. Beyond that, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. For clarification, students may contact the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department. Business courses in summer/winter programmes which are less than 3 weeks are not credit bearing.

9	Visa Application	Student has to check with the respective embassy for visa matters pertaining to the passport they are holding.		
		Normally Singaporean citizens do not need a visa for their short stay in Italy (up to 90 days). Students holding other passports should consult the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs website for relevant visa requirements, if subject to any.		
		Students are always recommended to contact the Italian Embassy/Consulate in Singapore/home country if they have specific visa questions and are required to keep themselves updated for the latest immigration policies via the website of the Embassy/Consulate and the information from the host university.		
10	Travel Advisories	Visit the MFA website for travel advisories on various countries from the Singapore government.		
11	Student Insurance	Although health insurance is not a compulsory requirement from AUR, in case the visa application requires you to have an adequate / a specific kind of insurance, it is obligatory for you to follow the requirements accordingly.		
		NUS students are covered under the NUS Students Travel Insurance scheme for official NUS trips. Please refer to		
		https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/ for details. However, students are advised to read through and understand its policy (coverage) and to review whether the terms and conditions as well as the duration of coverage are sufficient to suit their needs and to cover their entire journey abroad. If necessary, students may consider topping up for international coverage of their own health insurance or taking out a suitable travel insurance for themselves.
