7	Application Procedure	For students who apply by 18 Oct 2026: 1. Apply in EduRec by 18 Oct 2026, providing ALL information requested below: a. Your full name (as per your passport) b. Your surname c. Your date of birth (in DD/MM/YYYY format) d. Your place of birth, birth continent and birth territory (e.g. Singapore, Asia, Singapore) e. Your mobile number (please include country code if it's not a Singapore number) 2. Apply at UNICATT's portal by 1 Nov 2026 NUS Global will nominate students on a rolling basis before 23 Oct 2026 so that students can enjoy the €75 application fee waiver. You will receive instructions from UNICATT on how to complete your application at their portal once nomination by NUS is received. Kindly note that NUS will NOT nominate you if you fail to provide the relevant information as stipulated above by 18 Oct 2026. For students who apply after 18 Oct 2026 or students who do not wish to submit their personal details to NUS Global: Apply concurrently via EduRec and UNICATT as a Free-mover applicant by 1 Nov 2026. For all the note: • You must accept both the EduRec offer and the host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme. • Only upon acceptance of the EduRec offer can you proceed with course mapping and application for financial aids. We require all NUS students going on NUS endorsed summer/winter programmes to apply via EduRec. Besides allowing you to submit course mapping and apply for financial aid, this allows NUS to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while you are overseas. Additionally, NUS can also provide supporting letters for visa application and NS deferment (for NSmen). Please read the application guide before applying for the programme with NUS.
8	Course Mapping	Students interested in transferring units can start the course mapping process after applying and accepting the offer for the programme in EduRec. Course mapping requests are subject to approval from the Faculties. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping.

		Please also note that students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 units for each Winter Programme. A total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional units mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees. For details, visit the Office of the University Registrar's website.
9	Transcript	Transcript will be released approximately one month after the end of the programme. Please provide your personal mailing address to the host university so that they can send your transcript to you directly after the programme. If the host issues an electronic transcript, please provide your own NUS email address to receive the transcript. Please do not request that your transcript be sent to NUS Global; NUS will not be responsible for missing transcripts.

10	Visa Application	Check the general Italian visa application guidelines on the Italian visa information website to find out if you need a study visa. If you require a visa, make sure you follow the steps shared in this website: https://international.unicatt.it/ucscinternational-winter-programmes-post-admissions-for-non-eu-students. If you require GRO to issue a supporting letter for your visa application, NS deferment or OSP loan application, you may submit your request via this form after you have applied in EduRec and received confirmation of acceptance from the host university. Please note that you are responsible for obtaining a valid visa before making any travel arrangements for your summer/winter programme. Students are encouraged to prepare and apply for visa as early as possible, as obtaining a visa might be time consuming.

12	Student Insurance	NUS Student Travel Insurance is provided for your participation in this programme. Please request a certificate of insurance from the insurer directly following the instructions detailed in: https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/. (Log in using your NUSNET ID and password.) Students are responsible for ensuring that they have sufficient travel insurance coverage for the full duration of their trip (including travelling). Please review the insurance coverages to ensure that they meet your needs. Students may purchase additional health and/or travel insurance from their preferred agent.
