PROGRAMME DETAILS		
3	<b>Content</b>	Tohoku University Japanese Programme (TUJP) is a short programme designed to improve your Japanese proficiency and deepen your understanding of Japan. The programme consists of intensive Japanese lessons on traditional and modern Japanese culture and society including collaborative learning activities with local Tohoku University students. Students will also be paired with local students during the programme.
4	<b>Eligibility Requirements</b>	NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply, please see <a href="#">GRO website</a> for details.  Please refer to the host university's requirements <a href="#">here</a> .
5	<b>Accommodation</b>	Students should arrange housing themselves. While TUJP can provide information on suitable off-campus housing, the Tohoku University International Support Center can also assist with reserving off-campus housing (hotels etc.).  Please notify TUJP if you wish to apply (Housing fee: about JPY 50,000 (2 weeks)). However, TUJP cannot guarantee the availability of UH rooms. TUJP will inform students of whether rooms are available at UH when notifying students of their acceptance.
6	<b>Application Procedure</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ You <b>must</b> apply concurrently via EduRec and through the host university website.</li> <li>✓ You <b>must</b> accept both EduRec and host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme.</li> <li>✓ Only upon acceptance of the EduRec offer can you proceed with course mapping and apply for financial aid.</li> <li>✓ Applying on EduRec will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while you are overseas. With an official application through EduRec, you will also be able to request GRO for supporting letters for visa application and NS deferment (for NSmen).</li> </ul>
7	<b>Course Mapping</b>	You can start the course mapping process after you apply in EduRec and accept the offer for the programme.  For clarification, students may contact the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department before applying for the programme.  Students may map up to a maximum of 10 Units for each Summer Programme. Over the course of study in NUS, students may map up to a total of 12 Units for summer programmes. Beyond 12 Units, NUS Special Term tuition fees will apply, in addition to Summer/Winter Programme fees paid to the host university. For details, visit the Office of University Registrar's

8	<b>Visa Application</b>	<p>It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they obtain a valid visa (if required) before making any travel arrangements for their programme. Students are encouraged to prepare and apply for visa as early as possible (if required) as obtaining a visa can be time consuming.</p>
9	<b>Student Insurance</b>	<p>NUS will continue to offer NUS Travel Insurance for approved study abroad programmes including short-term programmes.</p> <p>Students are responsible for ensuring that they have sufficient travel insurance coverage. Exclusions to the NUS blanket travel insurance may apply. Students may consider purchasing additional travel insurance if required.</p>
