5	Eligibility Requirements	<p>NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply, please see GRO website for details. Applications and selections are subject to review by the host university.</p>										

6	Accommodation	<p>International Winter Campus dormitories cannot be applied for separately; you must apply for them concurrently with your International Winter Campus application. For dormitory cancellations, new applications, or room type changes, please inquire via email (kuwinter@korea.ac.kr).</p> <p>Buildings and room types are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Please be aware that Single Rooms may fill up early.</p> <p>After dormitory applications end, a Roommate Preference Survey will be sent via email around the end of November. You must apply concurrently via <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • EduRec (in order to be able to proceed with course mapping and submission of financial aids application) and • host university online application website 2. You must accept both <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The EduRec offer and • host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme. <p>✓ Only upon acceptance of the EduRec offer can you proceed with course mapping and application for financial aids.</p> <p>✓ Applying on EduRec will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while you are overseas. With an official application through EduRec, you will also be able to request GRO for supporting letters for visa application and NS deferment (for NSmen).</p> <p>Please read the application guide before applying for the programme with NUS.</p>
8	Course Mapping	<p>Students interested in transferring units can start the course mapping process after applying and accepting the offer for the programme in EduRec. Course mapping request is subjected to approval from the Faculties. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping.</p> <p>Please also note the following: Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 units for each Winter Programme. Course mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools.</p> <p>A total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional units mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees. For details, visit the Office of the University Registrar's website.</p>

9	Transcript	<p>Please provide a valid, personal mailing address to the host university so that the host can send your transcript to you directly after the winter programme. If the host issues an electronic transcript, please provide your personal NUS email address to receive the transcript.</p> <p>Please do not request your transcript to be sent to NUS Global Relations Office (GRO). GRO is not responsible for missing transcripts.</p>

10	Visa Application	<p>Students from countries or regions where Korea has signed a Visa waiver agreement may enter Korea without a visa for the winter programme.</p> <p>Singaporeans are not required to apply for a visa or K-ETA. Exemption of K-ETA application for Singaporeans is until 31 December 2024.</p> <p>For students of other nationalities, please visit the K-ETA website and check if your country is listed in the drop-down list. If you are unable to locate your country in the drop-down list, please apply for an appropriate visa. (D-2-8 Short-term Student Visa or C-3-1 Short-term Visiting Visa.)</p> <p>If you are able to locate your country in the drop-down list, please apply for K-ETA online if your purpose of entry is tourism, business, short-term study or family visit. However, if your purpose of visit is not covered by K-ETA or if your K-ETA application has been denied, please apply for an appropriate visa.</p> <p>It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they obtain a valid visa before making any travel arrangement for their winter programme. Obtaining a visa may be time consuming. Students are encouraged to prepare and apply for a visa as early as possible. Eligible applicants who complete paying the application fee, tuition fee, and submitting the required documents will receive the supporting documents for visa application by KU IWC office. Please refer here for how to request for these documents.</p> <p>If you require GRO to issue a supporting letter for your visa application, you may submit your request via this form after you have applied in EduRec and received confirmation of acceptance from the host university.</p>
11	Travel Advisories	<p>Visit the MFA website for travel advisories on various countries from the Singapore government.</p>
12	Student Insurance	<p>KU IWC requires all participants to purchase their insurance before going to Korea. Purchasing insurance is not necessary for Korean citizens covered by national health insurance. If your home school offers free insurance for study abroad, you can be exempted from submitting insurance documents.</p> <p>NUS Student Travel Insurance is provided for your participation in this programme. Please request a certificate of insurance from the insurer directly following the instructions detailed in:</p>
