12	Visa Application	<p>From 25 February 2026, most travellers who previously entered the UK visa free must apply for an Electronic Travel Authorisation (ETA) before travel. An ETA allows short-term study of up to six months but does not guarantee entry, as all students must still pass UK border control. Students studying in the UK for less than six months (e.g. one semester; short-term programmes) will need an ETA if travelling on a Singapore passport. Those studying for more than six months must apply for a Student Visa.</p> <p>Check if you need a UK visa - GOV.UK</p>
