8	Module Mapping	<p>You can start the module mapping process after you apply in EduRec and accept the offer for the programme. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for module mapping.</p> <p>Students may map up to a maximum of 10 MCs for each summer programme. A total of 12 MCs from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional MCs mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees. Students should inquire with the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department on being considered for a fee waiver. 9	Visa Application	<p>Students will need to obtain a Student Visa in order to attend a summer programme in the United States.</p> <p>For Boston University Summer Term, an I-20 document will be required to apply for the F-1 visa. To obtain a summer I-20 document, you must be a full-time student in the summer. Full time is defined as enrollment in 8 credits (typically two courses) in a six-week summer session or a minimum of 12 credits (typically three courses) if studying in both sessions.</p> <p>Once BU has registered you for your summer courses, BU will provide you with your summer I-20 document.</p> <p>How to obtain your F-1 student visa</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pay the SEVIS fee to the US government and obtain a receipt. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Once you have submitted all required registration documents, you will be provided with your Boston University summer I-20 document. Instructions on how to pay the SEVIS fee will be included with your Boston University I-20 document. You will need your payment receipt to apply for your F-1 student visa at a US embassy or consulate 2. Complete your visa application and schedule your F-1 visa appointment with your local US embassy or consulate. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Be sure to plan ahead, as the visa processing time for each US embassy and consulate varies. You must schedule this appointment in advance so that you have enough time to receive the F-1 visa before leaving your home country to come to the US.

11	Student Insurance	<p>NUS students embarking on a university-endorsed overseas programme are covered under NUS Travel Insurance. For more information on the coverage, please refer here: https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/</p> <p>Students are strongly encouraged to purchase a supplemental travel insurance to ensure they are adequately covered during their summer programme.</p> <p>In addition, the state of Massachusetts requires all full- and part-time international students who study on campus to submit proof of immunization against the following communicable diseases: measles, mumps, rubella (MMR); tetanus (must be Tdap vaccine); hepatitis B; (bacterial) meningitis; varicella; and tuberculosis (depending on country of origin).</p> <p>Once you have been registered for Summer Term, the BU Summer Sessions Office will provide instructions on how to upload your vaccination history to the BU’s Patient Connect portal.</p> <p>If you are not in compliance with all Boston University immunization requirements when you arrive on the BU campus, you will have seven days to obtain the necessary vaccination(s) or you will be considered non-compliant. You may obtain vaccinations (by scheduling an appointment in advance) at:</p> <p>Student Health Services 881 Commonwealth Avenue Boston, MA 02215 Phone: +1 617-353-3575 Medical insurance</p> <p>All international students enrolled during the summer are required to have medical insurance, and are automatically enrolled in and charged for Boston University’s Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP) as part of their registration. Students may waive enrollment in the SHIP if they are enrolled in a comparable US-based insurance plan. More information regarding the SHIP waiver requirement can be found here.</p> <p>Two levels of individual coverage are available: Basic and Plus. Students are charged at the Basic level with their registration and may request Plus coverage by emailing insmed@bu.edu at least two weeks prior to the start of their summer courses.</p> <p>Students who register for the Summer 1 session or for both the Summer 1 and Summer 2 sessions will be charged for the full summer coverage period of May19 – August 14, at a rate of US\$788. Students who will only be attending the Summer 1 session should email insmed@bu.edu prior to the end of their</p>

		<p>Summer 1 studies to request the Summer 1 only coverage period of May 19 – June 29, at a rate of US\$376. Students who register for just the Summer 2 session will be charged for enrolment in the basic-level plan of the Summer 2 coverage period of June 30 – August 14, at a rate of \$412.</p> <p>Student Health Services</p> <p>Boston University Student Health Services, located at 881 Commonwealth Avenue, is available for urgent care issues by appointment, Monday through Friday, from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm (opens at 10 am on Thursdays). Visiting summer students are charged a fee of US\$25 to your student account for each visit.
