5	Eligibility Requirements	<p>NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply, please see GRO website for details.</p> <p>Columbia University requires all admitted students to have a CAP of 3.75 or higher (3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale).</p>

7	Application Procedure	<p>Apply via EduRec and the host university's website <u>concurrently</u>. You must accept both the EduRec offer as well as the host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme.</p> <p>Students are strongly encouraged to apply to Columbia by 1 Feb 2022 to take advantage of the enrolment priority deadline. Otherwise the deadlines are 21 March 2022 for Session A and 2 May 2022 for Session B.</p> <p>Other things to take note on the application/supporting documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You will be required to select the appropriate category, "Visiting Undergraduate Student" or "Visiting Graduate Student", when starting

9	Visa Application	<p>Students admitted to study at Columbia University who are not United States citizens or permanent residents must be a full-time student at Columbia – registered for at least 6 points of credit-bearing courses in a 6-week session or 12 points of credit-bearing courses in the entire 12-week summer period – in order to be eligible for a student (F-1) visa.</p>
