Information for summer 2023 courses will be released in early to mid-January 2023.</p> <p>Course Descriptions</p> <p>You may visit the UCLA Registrar's website for course descriptions or view the description of a specific course you have selected on the Schedule of Classes. When viewing the desired course, select the "Section" number to access additional information about the class.</p> <p>UCLA Course Numbering</p> <p>Each UCLA course is numbered from 1-599 (e.g., English 101). Below is a description of the UCLA course numbering system. Please select courses that best meet your current academic standing.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1-99: Lower division courses designed for undergraduate freshmen and sophomores • 100-199: Upper division courses designed for undergraduate juniors and 	

		<p>seniors</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 200-499: Graduate and professional courses • 500-599: Graduate courses - open ONLY to current UCLA graduate students <p>Course Restrictions Although the majority of summer courses are open to visiting non-UCLA students, a select few summer courses are restricted to "UCLA students only". To view course restrictions, visit the Schedule of Classes, search for your desired course, then click on the "Section" number.</p> <p>Requisites Some courses may require you to have taken specific courses or fulfilled certain requirements to enroll. Transcripts or proof of completion of a requisite course is not required for visiting Summer Sessions students. Although proof of requisite completion is not required, visiting students should have experience comparable to the listed requisite.</p> <p>Please read the description of the courses you intend to take before enrolling to decide if they are right for you.</p>
5	Eligibility Requirements	NUS' generic eligibility requirements apply, please see NUS GRO website for details.
6	Accommodation	<p>UCLA offers furnished residence halls and residential suites within easy walking distance of classrooms, libraries, and recreational facilities for summer students who are 15 years of age or older by the first day of summer (i.e., 21 Jun 2023).</p> <p>Most students find living on campus to be a convenient and enjoyable option during Summer Sessions. 7	Application Procedure	<p>Please apply for this programme via EduRec first and then wait for GRO to provide additional information on applying/registering at UCLA. This is to ensure you receive the Registration Fee discount. Students who do not wait for further instruction from GRO run the risk of accidentally being charged the full Registration Fee and GRO is not able to guarantee a refund from UCLA.</p> <p>UCLA Registration opens 15 February 2022. The USD 850 registration fee is discounted to USD 350.00 for NUS students*. After completing the registration, you will receive access to enrolment on MyUCLA.</p> <p>*If prompted to pay the USD 850 Registration Fee, please check with NUS GRO by writing to global@nus.edu.sg before proceeding with payment.</p> <p>Registration Deadlines for international students: Sessions A & B: 1 April 2023 (EduRec) Sessions A & B: 1 May 2023 (by UCLA)</p>
