NUS Financial Aid

You should have enough monetary funds to last you throughout the whole i-SP programme. Your decision to go on i-SP should not be dependent upon the confirmation of a scholarship or bursary award. You can consider the following financial aid options to fund your i-SP:

For Singaporeans only:

- NUS Awards for Study Abroad (NASA) Enhancement Bursary
- Overseas Student Programme (OSP) Loan
- Post-Secondary Education Account (PSEA) Funds
- Opportunity Enhancement Grant (OEG)

Please note that if you are successful for any financial aid, the funds will only be disbursed to you <u>after</u> completion of the programme.

PROGRAMME DETAILS Academic The best way for students to find courses they are interested in would be to go to Content UCLA's online course schedule at: https://sa.ucla.edu/ro/public/soc. The classes can be filtered by session and subject area. When viewing the desired course, select the "Section" number to access additional information about the class. **UCLA Course Numbering** Each UCLA course is numbered from 1-599 (e.g., English 101). Below is a description of the UCLA course numbering system. Please select courses that best meet your current academic standing. 1-99: Lower division courses designed for undergraduate freshmen and sophomores 100-199: Upper division courses designed for undergraduate juniors and seniors 200-499: Graduate and professional courses 500-599: Graduate courses - open ONLY to current UCLA graduate students Course Restrictions Although the majority of summer courses are open to visiting non-UCLA students, a select few summer courses are restricted to "UCLA students only". To view course restrictions, visit the https://sa.ucla.edu/ro/public/soc, search for your desired course, then click on the "Section" number. Requisites Some courses may require you to have taken specific courses or fulfilled certain requirements to enroll. Transcripts or proof of completion of a requisite course is not required for visiting Summer Sessions students. Although proof of requisite completion is not required, visiting students should have experience comparable to the listed requisite. Please read the description of the courses (https://registrar.ucla.edu/academics/course-descriptions) you intend to take before enrolling to decide if they are right for you. Requirements 6 Accommodation UCLA offers furnished residence halls and residential suites within easy walking distance of classrooms, libraries, and recreational facilities for summer students who are 15 years of age or older by the first day of summer (i.e., 21 Jun 2023). Most students find living on campus to be a convenient and enjoyable option during Summer Sessions. Housing is available for periods of 6, 8, 9, 10, and 12 weeks. 7	Application Procedure	Please apply for this programme via EduRec first and then wait for NUS Global to provide additional information on applying/registering at UCLA. This is to ensure you receive the International Student Service Fee discount. Students who do not wait for further instruction from NUS Global run the risk of accidentally being charged the International Student Service Fee and NUS Global is not able to guarantee a refund from UCLA.
		UCLA Registration opens 15 February 2024. After completing the registration, you will receive access to enrolment on MyUCLA (https://www.my.ucla.edu/).
		*If prompted to pay the US\$500 International Student Service Fee, please check with NUS Global by writing to global@nus.edu.sg before proceeding with payment.

8	Module Mapping	You can start the module mapping process after you apply in EduRec and accept the offer for the programme.
		Students may map up to a maximum of 10 MCs for each summer programme. A total of 12 MCs from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional MCs mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees. Students should inquire with the SEP administrators/coordinators at their respective home Faculty/School Dean's Office or the academic department on being considered for a fee waiver. 		Health insurance is a requirement by the US federal government for all international students — no exceptions . Due to the high cost of health care in the United States, international students who receive the Form I-20 from UCLA are automatically enrolled in a two-part health insurance plan - BruinCare and Blue Cross/Blue Shield

		(PPO). Health insurance cannot be waived.
		A service fee (co-pay) may be charged before services are provided. It is important that students inform him/herself of all charges BEFORE obtaining treatment.
