		 Maximum of 2 courses (up to 10 units) can be mapped per summer / research programme during Special Term (May – August). Maximum of 1 course (up to 5 units) can be mapped per winter / research programme during year-end vacation (December – January). Total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional units mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees. 9	Visa Application	Students admitted to study at Columbia University who are not United States citizens or permanent residents must be a full-time student at Columbia – registered for at least 6 points of credit-bearing courses in a 6-week session or 12 points of credit-bearing courses in the entire 12-week summer period – in order to be eligible for a student (F-1) visa.
