Have successfully completed at least one term of college or university courses following graduation from high school prior to applying. 8	Course Mapping	Students interested in transferring units can start the course mapping process after applying and accepting the offer for the programme in EduRec. Course mapping request is subjected to approval from the Faculties. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping. Also note the following:	

Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 units for each Winter Programme. Course mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools. A total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional units mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees.

11	Student Insurance	NUS students embarking on a university-endorsed overseas programme are covered under NUS Travel Insurance. For more information on the coverage, please refer here: https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/ Students are strongly encouraged to purchase a supplemental travel insurance to ensure they are adequately covered during their summer programme. In addition, students may be required to enroll in Stanford's Cardinal Care insurance package. IHP students would be eligible to receive services at Stanford's Vaden Health Center, which include primary care medical services, counseling and psychological services, and health and wellness programs. At Stanford, all registered students are required to pay the Health Services Fee. This fee is mandatory and separate from the health insurance charge. The fee covers primary care medical services, counseling and psychological services, and health and wellness programs administered on campus at Stanford's Vaden Health Center.
