7	Application Procedure	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Please apply through the NUS Education Records System - Global Education (EduRec-GE). Applying through EduRec-GE will allow GRO to contact and assist you in times of crisis/emergency while overseas. With an official application through EduRec-GE, you are covered by the NUS Travel Blanket Insurance. 2. You should also concurrently apply to the host university once you have applied to NUS Edu-Rec.
8	Course Mapping	<p>Students interested in transferring units can start the course mapping process after applying and accepting the offer for the programme in EduRec. Course mapping requests are subjected to approval from the Faculties. Click here for a step-by-step guide on applying for course mapping.</p> <p>Please also note the following: Students may map up to a maximum of 10 units for each Summer Programme and up to a maximum of 5 units for each Winter Programme. Course mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools.</p> <p>A total of 12 units from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional units mapped will be subjected to Special Term fees. For details, visit the Office of the University Registrar's website.</p>
