PROGRAMME DETAILS				
4	Academic Content	Course title: Afropolitanism, Social Justice and Entrepreneurship		
		Designed to inspire students to be global citizens, this course presents comprehensive insights into South African history, politics, culture, social justice and social entrepreneurship. The course connects the past to the present, discussing opportunities and challenges of transformation facing the country, the African continent and the world today. Through engagement and immersion in the local Cape Town context, students will reflect on values of social justice and responsibility, gaining insights into the interconnectivity between their own societies and the rest of the world. Visits to historical, heritage and entrepreneurial community sites will allow students to experience the vibrant and diverse cultures that influence and shape the character of Cape Town and South Africa, as well as expose students to 2 innovative initiatives communities are undertaking to seek solutions to social issues. The course will also include a field trip to Robben Island, the Slave Lodge, District Six Museum, and visits to community social entrepreneurship sites.		
5	Eligibility Requirements	The course is open to students from diverse educational backgrounds, however students should have an interest in the following disciplines: History, Political Science, Sociology and Development.

6	Accommodation	Students will be housed on UCT's on-campus accommodation. Each student will have their own room, and breakfast will be provided daily.		
7	Application Procedure	Apply via <u>EduRec</u> and the <u>host university's website</u> concurrently . You must accept both the EduRec offer as well as the host university offer to confirm your participation in this programme.		
8	Module Mapping	If you are interested in obtaining credit, you can start the module mapping process after you apply in EduRec and accept the offer for the programme. Note that all mapping requests are subjected to approval by the Faculties. Click here for information on applying for module mapping. Please also note the following: Students may map up to a maximum of 10 MCs for each summer programme and up to a maximum of 5 MCs for each winter programme.		





Module mapping will be subject to approval from the respective Faculties/Schools.
 Of the MCs approved for mapping, a total of 12 MCs from a maximum of 2 overseas summer/winter and research programmes can be mapped without having to pay NUS tuition. Additional MCs mapped will be subjected to NUS Special Term fees. For details, visit the <u>NUS Registrar's</u> Office website.
