D. Exchange Duration	One semester
E. Course Load	Exchange students are required to enrol in a full academic workload of 24 points (equivalent to 4 units) per semester. Most units are worth six points each. Students can apply to undertake a reduced study load of 18 units (equivalent to 3 courses) with the permission of their home faculty. Kindly note that the maximum workload at UWA is 24 units per semester.
F. Accommodation	On-Campus Accommodation Exchange students can apply for on-campus accommodation via UWA Residential College Application Portal. Please note there is a fee for the housing application. https://livingoncampus.uwa.edu.au/StarRezPortalX/B7025FCB/1/1/Home-Welcome?UrlToken=BE2D689E Exchange students are recommended to apply for accommodation as early as possible, as on-campus housing is not guaranteed. G. Visa	Once you have purchased the Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC), your host university will issue an Electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE), which is required for your Australian Student Visa Application. All exchange students must obtain an Australian Non Award Student Visa (sub-class 500) before arriving in Australia. Students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they received the official offer letter/email from their host university. This is to ensure that you can obtain your visa in time before the start of your

H. Insurance	All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance. For more information on the university medical insurance, please refer to https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/ . All international students studying in Australia are required to purchase an approved Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) policy. OSHC is a condition of the Overseas Student Visa issued by the Australian Immigration
	authorities. The cost is approximately A\$350 for 6 months. Students can purchase OSHC through your host university.
	It is recommended that you purchase a comprehensive travel insurance for the full duration of your stay abroad, including your personal travel within/outside Australia. Please review the insurance coverages to ensure that they meet your needs. Students can purchase additional health and/or travel insurance from their preferred agent.
