ii) Deadlines

All NUS student must abide by the internal application deadline set by their home faculty for exchange participation in the following academic year. After clearing the internal application and selection process, students have to take note of the application deadline set by the host university.

Application deadline:

Term 1: 1 May (for FASS and FoS), 30 Apr (for BIZ) Term 2: 1 May (for FASS and FoS), 30 Apr (for BIZ)

Failure to submit a formal application to the host university will result your exchange being forfeited even if you have been selected by NUS for the exchange.

E. Accommodations

i) University Accommodation

Residence Services at UVic offers on-campus dormitory rooms or cluster units (private bedroom with shared kitchen and living room). Dormitory rooms include a mandatory meal plan. For more information, please refer to the following link:

Once students have been accepted to the ISS Exchange Program and have received their UVic Student number (which begins with V00), and have created their Netlink ID, they may apply for on-campus housing through the housing portal

(https://ress.uvic.ca/StarRezPortal/Default.aspx?Params=L9ezxPcQnQuRGKT zF%2b4sxeNblvAA%2b26c). Students without a V00 number will not be eligible for on-campus housing. Residence application fee is CAD\$50 (non-refundable). UVic on-campus residence spaces are limited and placement is not guaranteed.

ii) Private Accommodation

Students can choose to organise their own living arrangements off campus.

Arrival: Students planning to live off campus should arrive at least two weeks before classes begin in order to allow for enough time to find housing.
