i) Module Mapping & Credits Transfer	<p>Please ensure that your Study Plan is approved by the academics at your home faculty before the exchange. You can check with the SEP Coordinator in the Dean's Office of your home faculty.</p> <p>Modules approved in the past might not be offered by the host university or approved by your faculty when it is time for your exchange. Please check the latest course offerings at the host universities while you are preparing your Study Plan.</p>

v) Curriculum Structure	<p>Exchange students must be registered as full-time students during their studies at York, defined as registered in a minimum of 3 courses or 9 credits per semester or term. Students are allowed to take a maximum of 15 credits per term.</p> <p>The majority of courses offered at York International are valued at 3.0, 6.0 or 9.0 credits per course. The number of credits each course is valued at is indicated by the number which follows the four-digit course code number. Normally courses that run solely for one semester (either the Fall or Winter semester) are valued at 3.0 credits; these courses usually have one lecture per week. There are more rigorous one semester courses that are valued at 6.0 credits, because they meet 2 times per week.</p>
vi) Entry Requirements	<p>(a) be registered as a full-time undergraduate student of NUS</p> <p>(b) have successfully completed at least two (2) semesters of study at NUS upon admission to the host university;</p> <p>(c) not be eligible for exchange in the graduating semester</p> <p>(d) be a student of good standing at NUS with</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">a. a minimum upper division second class honours or;</p> <p style="margin-left: 20px;">b. a minimum B average grade or ;</p>

	c. a CAP of at least 3.5 (out of 5) for NUS students
vii) Language Proficiency Requirements	English is the official language of instruction at the York University. All applicants must demonstrate English language proficiency to be considered for admission to the exchange programme.

ix) Module restrictions and pre-requisites	<p>The following programs are NOT available for students participating in a York International Exchange:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nursing • Social Work • Biology (Graduate Level) • Programs offered by Schulich School of Business. • Human Resources Management (Graduate level) <p><u>School of the Arts, Media, Performance & Design (AMPD):</u> Open only to students participating in an official AMPD Exchange.</p> <p><u>Law (Osgoode Hall Law School):</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students may ONLY apply to the the JD Program and must enrol in upper year Osgoode courses • Students should have completed at least 6 semester of study and have successfully completed a substantial number of law courses. • Spaces are restricted to 1 or 2 students per partner institution. • A high GPA may also be required and the equivalent of a iBT:83 TOEFL score. <p><u>Political Science, Graduate level</u> Space is limited; exchange students must exceed minimum requirements.</p>

<p>i) Procedures</p>	<p>Once you have been nominated by NUS, you may complete the York International's Incoming Exchange Application. You may access the application portal via the following link:</p> <p>http://yorkinternational.yorku.ca/go-global/how-to-apply/</p> <p>You must upload your transcript together with your online application.</p>
<p>ii) Deadlines</p>	<p>All NUS student must abide by the internal application deadline set by their home faculty for exchange participation in the following academic year. After clearing the internal application and selection process, students have to take note of the application deadline set by the host university.</p> <p>Semester 1 (Fall term): 15 Mar Semester 2 (Winter term): 15 Mar</p> <p>Failure to submit a formal application to the host university will result your exchange being forfeited even if you have been selected by NUS for the exchange.</p>
