	iv)	Examination	Students are expected to attend the mandatory examination at Tuebingen during the official examination period until September. Be aware that earlier or extra examinations for exchange students might not be available and subjected to host university's discretion and approval.	
			Examination dates vary between Tuebingen departments but generally take place between July and September in semester 2.	
			Please be advised that the examination period in Business and Economics might last until two weeks after the end of the semester!	
			Please approach the respective Tuebingen's departmental coordinator <u>at</u> <u>the start of your exchange</u> for the exact examination dates. If the examination date clashes with NUS' academic calendar, please consider taking alternative modules which allows you to have the examination by late July.	
			Leave of Absence from NUS is subjected to your home faculty's approval and is not guaranteed.	



v)	Curriculum Structure	Two lectures and two seminars per semester are recommended. In addition students can attend courses in the area of German as a foreign language.

vii)	Language Proficiency Requirements	 Most of the bachelor courses are taught in German. Some departments offer a limited number of courses taught in English. Students who are nominated should have a good command of German and are able to follow courses in German or students who have found a sufficient amount of courses taught in English. They should either have B2 proficiency in German and/or English under the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Language Courses: Tuebingen offers more than 50 different courses in German language, history and culture per semester. You will find them on the website of the Division "German as a Foreign Language and Intercultural Programs" (http://www.uni-tuebingen.de/en/1056). Participants do not have to pay any fees, only course material, excursions etc. Tuebingen recommends their preparation courses which take place before the semester (language preparation, orientation, administrative help and so on): http://www.uni-tuebingen.de/en/1091

ix)	Module restrictions and pre- requisites	 Courses from Faculty Medicine is not open to exchange students. Availability in beginner's German language courses (A1/A2 level) are limited and cannot be guaranteed. Students who wish to study at Tuebingen Faculty of Science (= Natural Sciences) need to submit supporting documents such as a language certificate, Transcript of Records and Study Plan with a course list that can be sent to the Tuebingen Faculty of Science for approval.
D. Appli	cation	
i)	Procedures	Students can apply for SEP one year in advance through their home faculty in NUS between September and June. Please look out for your faculty's announcement regarding the application period. Once you have been selected by your home faculty for SEP, your faculty will contact you and provide information regarding application with your host university. Please prepare the necessary documents before the start of the application period at your host university. Nominated NUS students will be contacted by Tuebingen via email on the latest application procedures. Otherwise, students may refer to the information found here: http://www.uni-tuebingen.de/en/113870 Students need to apply online through Tuebingen's Application System. After completing the online application, student needs to print out the application form (a print version can be generated in the application system). The application form has to be stamped and signed by the coordinator of your home faculty at NUS and sent to NUS Registrar's Office through your Dean's Office.



	NUS Registrar's Office will consolidate all application and supporting documents from various NUS faculties and schools and send a batch delivery to Tuebingen.		
	The longer you took to apply to Tuebingen, the later you will get a reply on your application status. We recommend that you start your application once you receive the email from Tuebingen and get everything done before mid-December before the administrative offices slowed down for the year-end holidays.		
ii) Deadlines	All NUS student must abide by the internal application deadline set by their home faculty for exchange participation in the following academic year. After clearing the internal application and selection process, students have to take note of the application deadline set by the host university.		
	Deadline for submitting application to host university: Semester 1: 31 May Semester 2: 31 October		
	Failure to submit a formal application to the host university will result your exchange being forfeited even if you have been selected by NUS for the exchange.		
E. Accommodations			
i) University Accommodation	Accommodation is administered by the Studierendenwerk (Student Services Organization), which is not affiliated with the University.		
	You could possibly get the university accommodation if you submit an application before the deadline which will be mentioned in Tuebingen's acceptance email. For an overview of the dormitories, please see: <u>https://en.my-stuwe.de/housing/halls-of-residence-tuebingen/</u>		
	All rooms for exchange students are fully furnished single rooms with shared kitchen and usually shared bathrooms.		
	Students who have contract that ends in August or September are expected to pay for the rental until August or September. There will be no refund of the rental if you leave the student accommodation earlier.		
	Deposit for the student accommodation will only be returned to you after you have fulfilled the conditions for the full refund of deposit. It takes approximately four months for the rental deposit (if applicable) to be returned to you.		



Consular/Visa Regulation	EU citizens and citizens from the following countries do not need a visa to enter Germany: Australia, Canada, Honduras, Iceland, Israel, Japan, Korea, Liechtenstein, Monaco, New Zealand, Norway, San Marino, Switzerland and the United States. However, after entering Germany, you will have to apply for a residence permit at the local "Auslaenderbehörde" (Immigration Office) if you are staying for more than three months. Students from all other countries must apply for a visa for study purposes via the German diplomatic representation in their home country. You must not
	under any circumstances travel to Germany on a tourist visa.
	All students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they received the official offer letter/email from their host university.
	Some visa application process could take up to 2 months to process. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the immigration of the host country.

G. Safety, Health & Medi	cal Insurance
i) Health/Medical Insurance	In Germany health insurance is mandatory while you study at a German university. A student health insurance through a "gesetzliche" Krankenkasse" is possible until the 14th semester or until the age of 30. It costs approx. € 90 per month and is valid throughout the EU.
	Upon matriculation you either need to prove that you are insured by a "gesetzliche Krankenkasse" or exempted by them.
