1	When does the semester begin/end?	Semester 1 (Fall / Autumn) – September to January Semester 2 (Spring) – January to June Take note that final examinations may not be within the periods listed above.
2	Which faculties or schools accept exchange students?	CentraleSupélec is a graduate-level institution and offers courses in various STEM fields including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Computer Science and IT • Various fields in Engineering • Natural Sciences • Management and Economic Systems for Engineers • Languages
3	What modules can I read?	Course catalogue is available online at: https://www.centralesupelec.fr/en/study-centralesupelec Note that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Modules available in the past might not be offered by the host university and/or approved by NUS for module mapping during the time of your SEP. • First-year courses at CentraleSupélec are equivalent to Year 3 modules at NUS; Second-year courses are equivalent to Year 4 modules. Most of these courses are offered in both French and English. • Third-year courses at CentraleSupélec are not open to NUS students as they are offered on a full-year basis and taught primarily in French. • You can only read courses at one of CentraleSupélec's three campuses (Paris, Rennes, Metz).
4	What are the academic prerequisites and restrictions?	General requirements: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Completed 2 years of study prior to participating in SEP at CentraleSupélec. • English at B2 level; French at B1 level (to study courses taught in French). <p>It is important that you have the relevant academic background and meet the pre-requisites for the courses that you apply for. Academic workload is between 15 ECTS (min.) to 30 ECTS (max.) per semester.</p>

5	What are the available options for student housing?	<p>Limited on-campus housing is available for international students. Application will be open to students after their official admission.
