1	When does the semester begin/end?	Semester 1 (Fall / Autumn) – September to January Semester 2 (Spring) – February to June Take note that final examinations may not be within the periods listed above.
2	Which faculties or schools accept exchange students?	Université de Technologie Troyes (UTT) offers courses in various STEM fields to exchange students: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Control and Computer Engineering • Industrial Engineering • Informatics and Information Systems • Mechanical Engineering • Materials Science and Technology • Materials processes and Manufacture • Networks and Telecommunication <p>Master-level courses are available to students who have completed the required years of prior study before the exchange, and have met the pre-requisites for each course.</p>
3	What modules can I read?	The primary language of instruction at UTT is French. A number of English taught courses are available to exchange students: https://www.utt.fr/study-at-utt/courses-in-english Note that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Modules available in the past might not be offered by the host university and/or approved by NUS for module mapping during the time of your SEP. • UTT offers a free 4-week inter-semester programme in intensive French language for exchange students prior to the start of each semester. • Access to Master-level courses requires completion of at least 2 years of prior student prior to the SEP to UTT.
4	What are the academic prerequisites and restrictions?	English at B2 level; French at B1 level (to study courses taught in French). It is important that you have the relevant academic background and meet the pre-requisites for the courses that you apply for. Academic workload is 30 ECTS per semester.
