GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT HOST UNIVERSITY

1	When does the semester begin/end?	Semester 1 (Fall / Autumn) – August to February Semester 2 (Spring) – February to July Take note that final examinations may not be within the periods listed above. TU/e’s Semester 1 overlaps with the start of NUS’ Semester 2.
2	Which faculties or schools accept exchange students?	Exchange students are welcome to read courses from any department except the Eindhoven School of Education.
3	What modules can I read?	Online course catalogue available at: https://osiris.tue.nl/osiris_student_tueprd/OnderwijsCatalogusZoekCursus.do Note that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Modules available in the past might not be offered by the host university and/or approved by NUS for module mapping during the time of your SEP. • Exchange students are expected to take courses from one academic field and usually from only one department. Students interested to read courses from multiple departments should consult TU/e directly when completing the TU/e exchange application form and Learning Agreement. • Bachelor-level courses are mostly taught in Dutch, with most English-taught courses offered at the Master-level. Exchange students are allowed to read Master-level courses provided that they meet the prerequisites. It is recommended that NUS students complete five semesters of study (i.e. Year 3 Semester 1) before embarking on SEP to TU/e, so that they can meet the requirements for reading most Master-level courses.
4	What are the academic prerequisites and restrictions?	Only students who are in Year 3 of their study when embarking for SEP, can apply to go to TU/e. It is important that you have the relevant academic background for the courses that you apply for. You must have taken modules at NUS within the specific subject field to be accepted to any of the departments at TU/e.
