

# New comic book captures pandemic life in Singapore

The collective experiences of Singaporeans during the Covid-19 pandemic, with lives radically changed, have been documented in a new comic book titled *The Covid-19 Chronicles*.

Filled with cartoon illustrations, the book – conceptualised and written by the National University of Singapore’s Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine – pieces together memories of the last two years. The illustrations were done by Mr Andrew Tan and Ms Angee Neo. The book is set in the week before Valentine’s Day,

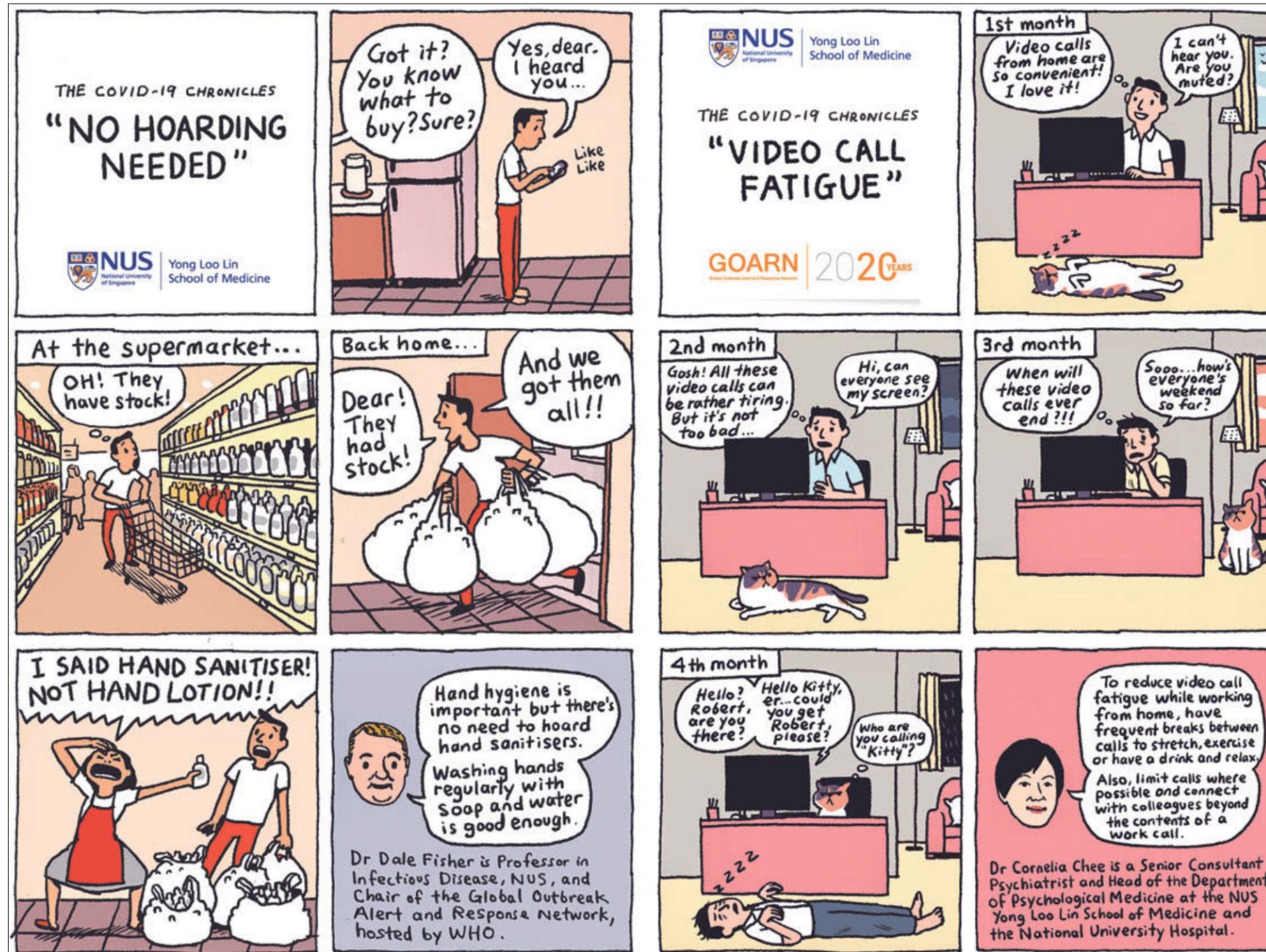
but instead of love, something else is in the air – a yet-unnamed virus that sets off fear, panic buying and confusion among Singaporeans. It then looks at the norms in this new normal, as well as some key milestones that Singapore has crossed in its Covid-19 fight.

This book combines humour, science and empathy in an understandable and accessible format.
