1) When can I apply for admission?

You may apply for admission from 17 December 2025 to 23 February 2026.

3) What are the admission requirements for IBDP students?

Only IBDP students who have been awarded an IB Diploma will be considered for admission. Please note that this is only the minimum eligibility criteria. Entry to the various programmes at NUS is very competitive and applicants who gain admission typically attain very good scores. Please refer to the website for more information.

4) How do I submit my IBDP results?

It is **mandatory** for **all** applicants to authorise the International Baccalaureate (IB) to release their IB official transcripts to NUS. Applicants can do so by informing their school's IB coordinator. Please key in your alphanumeric IB Personal Code (in lowercase only) in the application form for NUS to verify your results from the IB.

If you are applying with IB predicted grades and do not have your IB Personal Code, you may leave the field blank. We will email you to provide us with the IB Personal Code on a later date. Please refer to the IB website for details on how to request your transcripts via the IB.

5) Do I need to meet the Mother Tongue Language (MTL) requirement like the Singapore-Cambridge GCE A- Level students?

Some applicants are required to meet the Mother Tongue Language (MTL) requirement as set by the Ministry of Education (MOE), Singapore:

- Applicants who have been away from the Singapore school system for several years and have not continued studying their MTL (or an approved MTL-in-lieu) may be eligible for an MTL exemption.
- NUS will facilitate the MTL exemption application as part of the admissions process. Outcomes will be
 conveyed to applicants who receive an admission offer from NUS. Please note that MOE does not accept
 direct applications for MTL exemption. Applying for an exemption will not prejudice the evaluation of your
 admission application.
- Applicants who meet all admission requirements except the MTL requirement may still apply without
 prejudice to their application. Successful applicants will be admitted provisionally and must <u>fulfil the MTL</u>
 requirement by attaining the minimum grade stated above during their undergraduate studies to graduate.
- Information for private candidates on the Singapore-Cambridge GCE A-Level MTL paper and the GCE O-Level Higher MTL paper is available on the <u>Singapore Examinations and Assessment Board (SEAB)</u> website.

6) How and when will I know the outcome of my application?

You will be informed of your application outcome via the <u>Applicant Portal</u>. You may wish to check regularly for updates. This online portal will be made available after you have successfully submitted your online admission application. An email notification will also be sent once you have an admission outcome. Please check your junk/spam folders and mark NUS emails as "Not Spam". You will only be offered one programme of study from NUS if you are successful in gaining admission.

Applicants who are successful in gaining admission and have a valid local mobile number will receive an SMS notification. As the outcome will be released electronically, the electronic letter for the offer of admission will serve as the official document from the University. No hardcopy letter or email will be sent to you.

Application outcomes are typically released by the third week of May 2026 for applicants who have submitted their actual IBDP results by the application closing date, 23 February 2026. Applicants taking the IBDP examination in May 2026 will receive their application outcomes from the second week of July 2026, after the submission of their final IBDP results to NUS via the IB by 7 July 2026.

The Applicant Portal for your AY2026-2027 application can only be used during the admission period from the

point of application till **31** August **2026** to check your application status online. This online facility will close after 31 August 2026 and after which, it will **no longer be available**. Hence, applicants are encouraged to **download** and save the offer letter for future reference.

Please note that inaccurate or false information or omission of material information will render your application invalid. NUS reserves the right to reject applications that are incomplete or inaccurate. Persons admitted on the basis of inaccurate or false information may be expelled from NUS.

7) What are the programme prerequisites for the undergraduate programmes?

8) Besides my IB grades, what other factors will be taken into consideration for admission to NUS?

The University is adopting a holistic approach to assessing applicants for admissions into their chosen degree programmes. This means that besides academic grades, other factors, such as the applicant's <u>interest, aptitude, and prior preparation</u>, will also be used to admit the applicant. All applicants for all degree programmes will now be required to list up to four of their achievements, co-curricular activities, or non-academic activities (e.g. volunteer work, competitive sports) and to answer five short response questions, besides providing their grades.

For the University to better evaluate your application, you may list up to four achievements in the "Achievement" section of the application form. Examples of relevant achievements you may indicate include (but are not limited to):

- Medals won at the International Olympiads (Biology, Chemistry, Informatics, Mathematics and Physics)
- Representing Singapore in arts or sports competitions
- Active participation in community service and volunteering work
- Internship or substantial work experience that is related to your degree choices
- Key leadership positions in community service, or sports/arts associations, outside the school environment
- Leading role in entrepreneurship efforts
- Creation of a new software or app, or contribution to open-source software, that is used by many people

If you do not wish to list any achievements, please select the "Not Applicable" option.

9) When and how will I be informed if I am shortlisted for a faculty interview/ test?

Applicants will be notified via the <u>Applicant Portal</u> in April if they are shortlisted for selection tests and/or interviews. Some applicants may be invited for selection tests and/or interviews in May. Those who provide a valid Singapore mobile number in their application will be notified via SMS. Shortlisted candidates should download and/or print the electronic invitation letter for retention.

10) Do I need to attend interviews/ tests for admission to the undergraduate programmes?

Applicants who apply for admission to <u>Architecture, Landscape Architecture, Industrial Design, Dentistry, Law, Nursing and Medicine programmes</u> are required to attend selection tests and/or interviews. As part of the University's holistic assessment, some faculties might also require applicants to attend an interview for single/double/concurrent degree programmes. The shortlisted candidates will be informed to attend the interview(s).

11) When will the faculty interviews/ tests take place?

Details of faculty interview/ tests for Architecture, Landscape Architecture, Industrial Design, Dentistry, Law, Nursing and Medicine programmes are available here.

12) How and where do I submit my supporting documents?

You will be prompted to upload all relevant supporting documents when completing the online application form. If you wish to submit additional documents after you have submitted the online application, you may do so via the <u>Applicant Portal</u> by 23 February 2026.

All supporting documents must be submitted by 23 February 2026 for your application to be complete and considered for admission. The list of supporting documents to be submitted after submitting an online application can be found here.

13) Can I apply if I am taking my IBDP examinations in May 2026, and will receive my actual results in July 2026? If so, what kind of supporting documents do I need to submit?

If you are taking the IBDP examinations in May 2026 and receiving your actual results on 5 July 2026, you can apply with your **predicted IB results as attested and endorsed by your school** (i.e. with school stamp). The list of supporting documents to be submitted after submitting an online application can be found at <u>here</u>.

It is mandatory for all applicants to authorise the International Baccalaureate to release their International Baccalaureate (IB) transcripts to NUS. You can do so by informing your school's IB coordinator. Failure to submit your May 2026 IBDP results by 7 July 2026 will result in your application being deemed as incomplete and be excluded from admission consideration.

If you do not have your IB Personal Code at the time of application, we will contact you via email in May 2026 with instructions on how to submit it to us.

14) Do I need to indicate my National Service (NS) status on the application form?

The "National Service in Singapore" section on the application form is only applicable to Singapore Citizens and Singapore Permanent Residents who will serve/ are serving/ have served the National Service in Singapore.

If you have registered but have not enlisted or have not yet been notified to enlist, you do not need to provide the enlistment date in the application form. You should choose your NS status as "Registered / Waiting to be enlisted". However, should you register at any point in time, you should inform the Office of Admissions immediately.

Based on your NS status, you should also submit the relevant supporting documents (Screenshot of projected ORD from OneNS Portal / NS Service Transcript / Proof of Enlistment into Regular Service / Notice of Exemption from full-time National Service) for our verification.

If you are an international student who is going to serve/ serving/ have served your home country's compulsory military service, you do not need to indicate this information on the application form.

15) If I am exempted from National Service (NS), do I need to indicate it on the application form?

If you are exempted from NS, please choose "Exempted" for the NS status and you are required to send the Notice of Exemption from full-time National Service (endorsed by MINDEF) to the Office of Admissions for our verification. We may request that you to share the reason for exemption. Refer to Question 12 for more information on submission of supporting documents.

16) How much is the application fee?

The application fee is \$\$10 and is non-refundable.

17) When is the deadline for payment of application fee?

Payment of application fee is mandatory and must be made by 23 February 2026 for the application to be complete and considered for admission.

18) What are the modes of payment and processing times for application fee payments?

19) How do I apply for financial aid?

If you wish to apply for NUS-administered Financial Aid in support of your education at NUS, you should visit the Office of Financial Aid website for the latest information on application procedures and types of financial aid available. Applications for Financial Aid must be made after you have submitted your admission application to NUS. Applications for Financial Aid are open throughout the academic year, however for early consideration for NUS Donated Bursaries, please apply by the admission application deadline. In addition, please note that such Financial Aid applications should be made (1) after you have applied for admission and in the year you expect to begin your undergraduate studies., and (2) as soon as possible after you apply for admission if you require financial assistance to fund your study expenses and it is regardless of whether you have been offered admission to NUS, or if you intend to apply for scholarships and/or other forms of financial assistance offered or administered by sources other than the NUS Office of Financial Aid.

You may also wish to note that the Financial Aid <u>website</u> publishes information on other sources of financial assistance administered by external organizations (e.g. bank-administered Tuition Fee Loan (TFL) Scheme; CPF Education Scheme; Mendaki Tertiary Tuition Fee Subsidy~; and Post-Secondary Education Account~). In many instances, the respective administrators of such schemes require that applications be made immediately upon receipt of the admission offer from the University and within their stipulated deadlines. This is regardless of whether you have applied for NUS-administered Financial Aid.

20) How do I know if my application has been successfully submitted?

If you have successfully submitted your application, you will receive an acknowledgement email titled "Acknowledgement of Application to NUS Undergraduate Programmes" sent to the primary email address indicated in the online application. Your unique NUS application number will be shown on the acknowledgement email. You should save and/or print a copy of the acknowledgement page/email for your own reference.

21) After submitting my online application, how can I update my contact information, choice of programmes, achievements and/or household income?

You may log in to the Applicant Portal to update the following information before 23 February 2026.

You may submit multiple updates but only the last update received will be CONSIDERED. Each time you make a change, an acknowledgement email will be sent to the email address you have indicated on the online application form. The closing date to update contact information is 23 February 2026.

22) How do I appeal after receiving my application outcome?

The online appeal facility will be available after the release of application outcome in late May/ early June 2026. Please log in to the <u>Applicant Portal</u> if you wish to appeal against the admission decision. You may submit multiple appeals but only the last appeal received will be CONSIDERED. The outcome of your appeal will be released by end June 2026.

23) What documents should I submit if I am required to submit my predicted grades, but my school does not issue it directly to students?

You will need to apply with your latest set of IB / school results and submit it to us. You are required to request your school to send NUS your predicted grades directly. Your school should indicate your full name, application number and endorse your predicted grades when submitting your predicted grades to NUS at oambox12@nus.edu.sg. Your school should send your predicted grades by 23 February 2026.

24) If I am requesting a re-mark on my results, would you wait for the outcome of the re-marking before releasing an application outcome to me?

Your application will be reviewed based on your current set of results. If there are any changes to your results after the re-marking, your application will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

As it is <u>mandatory</u> for all applicants to authorise the International Baccalaureate (IB) to release their IB transcripts to NUS, we will be informed by IB if there are any changes to your IBDP results due to re-marking.

25) How do I submit my results if I have re-taken exam papers after graduation?

You are required to **re-authorise** the International Baccalaureate (IB) to release your IB transcripts to NUS. For example, if you have sat for the IBDP examination in November 2025 for the first time and re-took some IB subject exams in May 2026, you are required to re-authorise the IB to release your May 2026 IB results. It is essential that you do so, if not we would not be able to review your entire set of results.

You may submit the request for the IB to send your latest IBDP transcript to NUS via the IB website here.

26) I am a May 2026 IB Diploma Programme examination session applicant who is applying for NUS Medicine and would like to know where I can submit my UCAT scores?

You should submit your UCAT scores directly to the NUS Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine via the <u>NUS Medicine</u> <u>Admissions Portal</u>. The NUS Medicine Admissions Portal will open in February 2026.

27) Do I need to submit Qualifying English Test (QET) results if I took TOK in a non-English language (e.g. Chinese)?

The QET is not a condition for admission to NUS. Instead, QET is a mandatory test set by the Centre for English Language Communication (CELC) that all enrolled undergraduate students must take if they do not possess the necessary English language qualification. CELC only accepts the TOK in English with a minimum grade of C in order to be eligible for QET exemption. You may present other English test scores like IELTS or TOEFL to meet the QET qualifying exemption criteria; or take the QET.

You may refer to the <u>FAQs</u> on QET for more information.

28) Do I have to submit English test scores?

If <u>three</u> or more of your IB subjects are taught in a non-English language, you must submit an <u>English test score</u> to demonstrate readiness for English-medium study at NUS.
