NUS College offers an enhanced interdisciplinary educational experience, beyond the primary major, to undergraduates from over 60 majors across NUS. To apply, simply indicate your interest in NUS College during your admissions application. Your application will be considered for both the degree programmes that you are applying to and NUS College.

Qualifications & Admission Requirements

To apply, you should fulfil one of the following academic qualifications and have either completed or are in your final year of High School.

A-Level (AQA, Cambridge, Edexcel, London, OCR, Oxford International AQA, WJEC)*

Completed A-Level with at least three Advanced Level subject grades. Grades from two sittings taken within a 12-month period can be considered. Applicants with good grades in four Advanced Level subjects are preferred.

American High School Diploma

Completed High School and supported with standardised test scores.

Australian High School

Completed High School with at least ATAR of 90 or OP of 6.

Brunei A-Level*

Completed A-Level with three Advanced Level and two AS Level subjects (including GP) in the same sitting of the examination.

Canadian High School Diploma*

Completed High School with at least 90% for each subject.

Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examination (CAPE)

Completed CAPE with at least Grade II passes in all six subjects of which three subjects are two-unit subjects.

Danish Studentereksamen*

Completed Danish Studentereksamen (STX, HHX or HTX) with an overall average score of 9 or better and similar scores in relevant Level A and B subjects. C1 Advanced, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEFL is required.

European Baccalaureate Diploma*

Completed Diploma with at least 80% pass in 10 subjects.

French Baccalaureate Diploma*

Completed Diploma with an average of 15 or better. C1 Advanced, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEFL is required.

Gao Kao or PRC National College Entrance Examination

Completed Gao Kao with C1 Advanced, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEFL. Senior Middle 3 students who are not taking the Gao Kao examination should apply under 'Other High School Qualifications'.

German Abitur*

Completed Abitur with an overall average of 2.0 or better. C1 Advanced, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEFL is required.

Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE)

Completed HKDSE with at least three core subjects at Level 3 and two elective subjects, with a minimum of Level 4 in English.

Indian Standard 12 (All Qualifications)

Completed or are completing Indian Standard 12 in the year of admission. State Board applicants must submit standardised test scores. Applicants completing Standard 12 in the year of admission are not eligible to apply for Dentistry, Law, Medicine and Nursing. (The University may conduct additional aptitude tests for Architecture, Industrial Design and Landscape Architecture in June, subject to availability.)

Indonesian Ujian Nasional (UN)

Completed or completing UN / Ijazah Sekolah Menengah Atas in the year of admission, with C1 Advanced, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEFL.

International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma

Completed or are completing the IB Diploma in the year of admission with at least three HL and three SL subjects, plus TOK and EE. English must be one of the subjects. IB Certificate is not eligible to gain admission.

Italian Diploma di Esame di Stato*

Completed Italian Diploma di Esame di Stato with an overall average of at least 88% with C1 Advanced, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEFL.

Mauritius High School Certificate

Completed Mauritius A-Level with a good pass in at least three A-Level subjects and two AS level subjects (including GP), taken in the same sitting.

New Zealand National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) Level 3

Completed NCEA at Level 3 with Merit, and attained University Entrance Certificate.

Sijil Tinggi Persekolahan Malaysia (STPM)

Completed or are completing STPM with at least B for all subjects and MUET of 240 for exam session 2021 and onwards; 200 for exam session 2020 and earlier.

Sri Lanka A-Level

Completed Sri Lanka A-Level with C1 Advanced, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEFL.

Taiwan Senior High School

Completed General Scholastic Ability Test (GSAT) with C1 Advanced, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEFL. Applicants who are not taking the GSAT should apply under 'Other High School Qualifications'.

Thai Mathayom 6

Completed Mathayom 6 with overall GPA of at least 3.0 with C1 Advanced, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEFL.

Unified Examination Certificate (UEC)

Completed or completing UEC in the year of admission with EL1119, C1 Advanced, IELTS, MUET, PTE Academic or TOEFL.

Vietnam National High School Graduation Examination

Completed or completing High School Graduation Examination in the year of admission, with C1 Advanced, IELTS, PTE Academic or TOEFL.

Other High School Qualifications*

Completed High School qualification supported with standardised test scores.

English Language Requirement

English Language is the University's language of instruction. Besides submitting your high school qualifications for admission consideration, you may need to submit an English Language Test score or sit for the Qualifying English Test (QET).

To check if you are required to submit an English Language Test score, refer to pages 10 to 12. English Language Test scores are valid for two years.

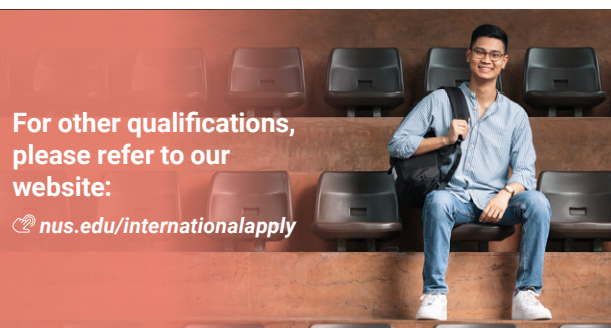

Additional Qualifications

Advanced Placement Courses

AP Calculus BC is required for all programmes except Law. AP courses must meet the prerequisites of the programmes you are applying for.

A minimum score of 3 per AP course is needed for admissions. Results from up to two examination sittings are accepted. Applicants for Law can take any listed course combinations, including AP Calculus AB. Acceptable AP courses for admissions consideration can be found at nus.edu.sg/oam/docs/default-source/defaultdocument-library/standardised_test.pdf and ap.collegeboard.org

ACT with Writing

The ACT consists of five sections: English, Mathematics, Reading, Science and Writing Test (optional). Apart from the minimum composite score of 29, the writing component score of 8 has to be met. The writing component is compulsory if you are submitting ACT with Writing in lieu of SAT. All ACT sections (inclusive of Writing) have to be taken in one sitting. We do not accept a combination of scores from different sittings. The validity of ACT scores is five years.

SAT

The SAT consists of two sections: Reading & Writing, and Mathematics. All SAT sections have to be taken in one sitting. We do not accept a combination of scores from different sittings. The minimum acceptable test scores are 600 for Reading & Writing, and 650 for Mathematics. The validity of SAT scores is five years.

Estimated Living Expenses

A full-time international undergraduate student incurs about S\$6,000 in living expenses per year and S\$5,750 in accommodation expenses (study period of 35 weeks), based on a conservative estimate for a comfortable lifestyle.

Financial Assistance Schemes

Loans, bursaries, and work-study opportunities are available to needy students. Simply apply for Financial Aid after you have applied for admissions. Financial Aid application is open from 23 February 2026. Submit your application by 15 April 2026 for earlier release of results and disbursement of funds before the tuition fee payment deadline.

MOE Tuition Grant

Provided by the Ministry of Education (MOE), the MOE Tuition Grant is awarded to international students competitively to help defray university education costs.

If you are awarded and accept the MOE Tuition Grant, you will pay subsidised fees and are required to work for a Singapore entity for three years upon graduation. If you are not successful, or have chosen not to apply for a Tuition Grant, you will pay nonsubsidised fees. You will also not be eligible for NUS and MOE-funded or administered Financial Aid and Scholarships during your entire degree programme candidature.

MOE Tuition Fee Loan

A Tuition Fee Loan (TFL) is also available on top of the MOE Tuition Grant to offset your tuition fee. The value of the TFL is up to 90% of the subsidised tuition fee payable by Singapore Citizens for the same degree programme.
