MOE Tuition Grant Declaration


Terms and Conditions

- I am required to sign a MOE Tuttion Grant Agreement with the Government of Singapore after matriculation, and secure employment and serve in a Singapore entity for 3 years upon graduation
- I am required to have two sureties to sign the MOE Tutlition Grant Agreement. My sureties must be above 21 and below 65 years of age, and must not be undischarged bankrupts.
- In applying for a MOE Tuition Grant, I confirm that I agree to the terms and conditions set forth above. Knowingly providing false information in this form is a criminal offence under Section 177 of the Penal Code is quipishable with imprisonment for a term up to 6 months, or a fine up to a maximum of \$5,000 or with both






