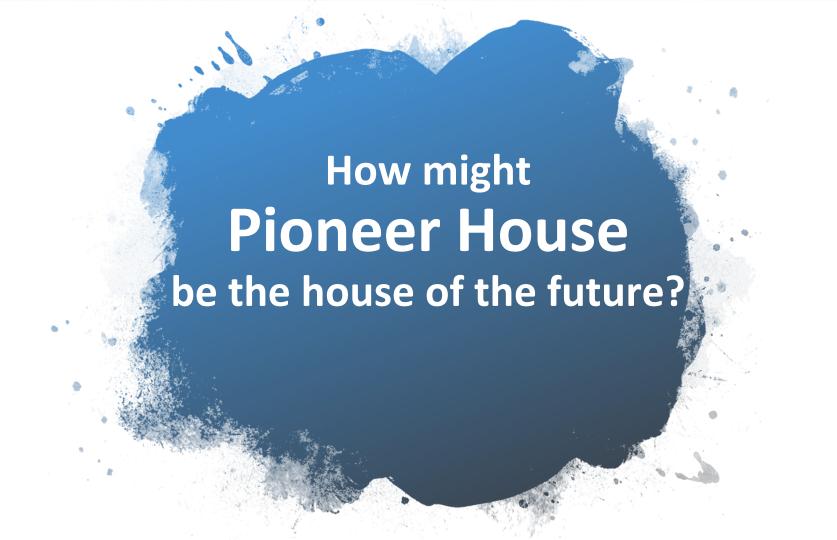

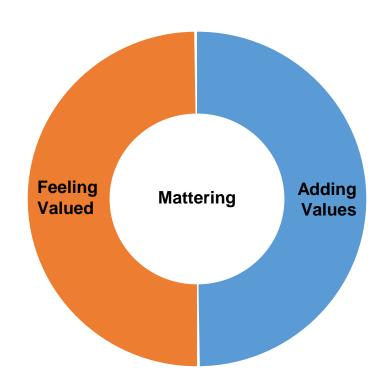
Sense of Belonging

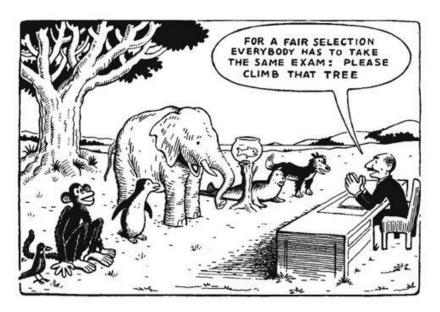

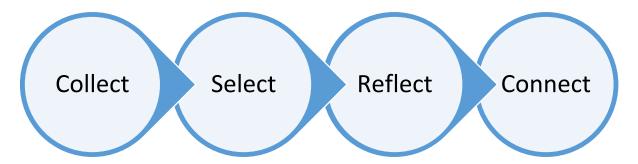
What is a Portfolio (a few definitions)

- A portfolio is a multidimensional, documented collection of student's work that is put together in an organised way and including a reflective discussion of the materials contained in the portfolio. [Annis and Jones, 1995]
- A portfolio is an approach to gauge student's accomplishments and growth. [Zubizarreta, 2009]

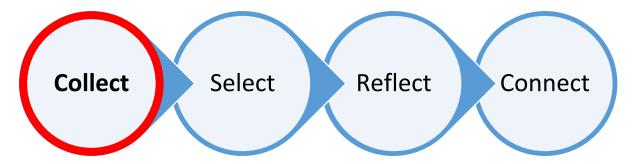
Why a Portfolio

- It affords time for reflection; to organise and clarify thoughts.
- It helps students realise if they have understood. Things that students cannot write are probably because they were not understood.
- It is a documented evidence of student's growth.
- It allows a comprehensive view of students beyond narrow dimensions.

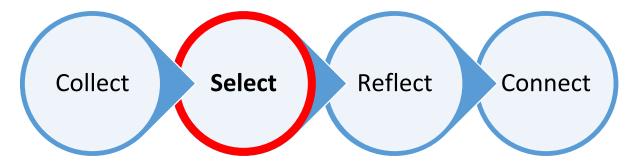

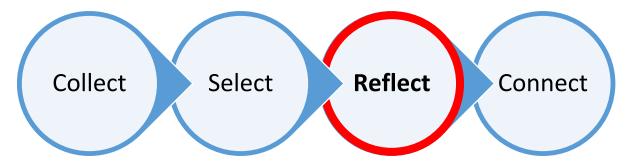

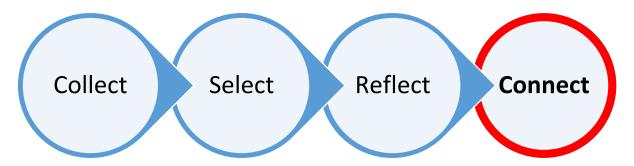
- Be engaged in activities in PH to build an inclusive community.
- Document your experience.
- Gather photos*, testimonials, or other evidences that you can use to visualize your experience.
 - * Photos should ideally be of a good quality, but not too large. A **1024 x 768**-pixels photo will be sufficient.



- Choose a few **(two)** of your experiences that can describe who you are and what values you can bring to the community.
- Beyond the quantity (e.g., attendance), consider the quality (e.g., impact) that you bring to the community.



- Think about your experiences.
- There is no one way to think about your experience, although you may want to share:
 - What you did
 - What made you do it
 - How it influences/impacts yourself and/or others



- Think how your experiences have developed you as a person.
- Share how you would like to contribute to developing PH community.
- There is no one way to think about your experience, although you may want to share:
 - The objectives (what you want to see happening in PH community and why this is important)
 - The action (what you want to do)
 - The suitability (why you are suited to this role)
 - The measures (how you would self-evaluate the success of the contribution)
