FAQ – New Fellows Nomination-Selection-Induction

- Is a Professorial Fellow under the part-time scheme eligible for nomination?
 Staff placed under the Professorial Fellow, part-time scheme will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- I have been a part-time adjunct Associate Professor at NUS. Although I have not been a full-time faculty member at NUJS for at least 3. Years, I have been a part-time adjunct Associate Professor for many years. The combined teaching period is more than 3 years. Would I still qualify? Candidates who do not meet the minimum requirement of 3 years as a full-time NUS faculty member would NOT be qualified.
- Will those who have sabbatical plans be eligible to apply? As long as staff are not expected to be away for longer than one or two semesters, they are eligible to apply. Your applications will be considered on a case-by-case basis by the committee. Please indicate such plans when submitting the application form.
- Do applicants under the self-nomination category have to come through the Dean's Office? Applicants under the self-nomination category do NOT have to go through the Deans' Office.
- I am a current OEA nominee. Do I still have to fill in the 'declaration by proposer'? As an OEA nominee, you can apply directly to the Academy to be considered for the position of Fellow. You must complete all sections except 4 and 8. For sections 5 and 7, nominees can extract relevant information from their OEA dossiers. You are not required to be supported by a proposer.

What is the duration for the Fellowship?
 Fellows will be appointed for a 3-year term and there is a provision for Fellows to serve for another 3-year term through an internal voting procedure.
