What is REx?

Research Experience (REx) programme was launched in January 2023 at CHS and has now expanded to other faculties including SoC.

It's main objective is to encourage more undergraduate students in NUS to partake in research through **UROP** by providing grants, workshops and opportunities for students to take ownership and showcase their work through conferences and networking opportunities.



Why should students consider taking UROP?

Benefits of undergraduate research

- Helps students put their theory into practice
- Develop highly useful transferrable skills such as problem-solving, critical thinking skills, resourcefulness and effective communication
- Early training in research for those keen to take up FYP, pursue graduate studies or a career in research and innovation

Overview of UROP+REx

Four components of UROP+REx:



REx Grant

All REx Fellows have access to a **\$2500 grant** which can be used to support expenses related to their research project. REx Fellows have until their final semester in NUS to access the grant.

The **default** process of accessing the grant is by **reimbursement** whereby students make any necessary purchases and claim the amount by submitting reimbursement form(s) attached with receipts.

How do REx Fellows claim from the grant?

- 1) Fill up reimbursement form and attach all relevant receipts into a single PDF file.
- Email completed reimbursement form to NUS REx at pvobox66@nus.edu.sg. More than one form can be submitted if needed.

REx Workshops

REx Fellows are to attend a **minimum of 5 REx workshops** over 12 months.

This should comprise of **two core workshops** (Ethics in Research and Research Methodologies) and **three elective** workshops of choice.

All REx workshops are conducted in person at either Central Library or Medicine+Science Library, unless otherwise stated.

Workshops are scheduled between Week 6 to Week 13 of Semesters 1 and 2. Schedule will be announced by Week -1 of each semester.

Research Showcase

As part of our objective to encourage UROP students to showcase their work beyond graded presentations and to take ownership of their projects, REx Fellows are required to showcase their research via either one of the following options:

Present their research at the annual UROP+REx Conference Participating in Researcher Unbound Plus hosted by PVO-UGRC and NUS Libraries Submission of a research deliverable in relation to research project

* UROP report submitted to supervisors for grading **cannot** be double counted as research deliverable.



Completion of Fellowship

- Students should complete the following components within 12 months upon onboarded as a REx Fellow:
 - 1. Attend at least five REx workshops (including Research Methodologies and Ethics in Research)
 - 2. Either one of the following **research showcase** options:
 - a) Presentation of research work during annual UROP+REx Conference
 - b) Participation in RU+ workshops hosted in collaboration with NUS Libraries
 - c) Submission of a deliverable of chosen format in relation to UROP project (e.g. research poster, slide deck presented at a local or international conference or executive summary)
- Self-Evaluation forms are to be submitted to PVO upon completion of all REx components.

Official e-Certificate of Completion will be issued via Accredible when REx Fellows complete all components of the course upgrade.

Eligibility

- Currently applying for CP3209 in upcoming semester <u>or</u> Have completed 1 semester of CP3209
- Have at least 60 units at the point of applying (including units enrolled during the project selection semester)
- Timeline (for Semesters 1 and 2)
 - Week 3: Deadline for SOC students to upgrade to UROP+REx

(Sem 1 AY2425: 30 August 2024)

 Week 5: Students, Supervisors and Course Admins will be informed of application outcome. REx Fellows onboarded to REx CANVAS page REX1000.

Eligibility and Application Matters

Application procedure

- Download REx Fellows' Grant Proposal Form from NUS Undergraduate Research website
- Email completed form to NUS REx at <u>pvobox66@nus.edu.sg</u>
- Students, supervisors and course admins will be informed of application outcome latest by Week 5

Administrative Matters

Upon upgrading to UROP+REx:

- Allocation of 0 Unit rider course code CP3209R on EduREc
 - REx Fellows will have 2 course codes (CP3209 and CP3209R) reflected on EduREc
- Onboarding to REX1000 CANVAS page (accessible to REx Fellows until graduation unless withdraws from programme)
- Allocation of UROP CANVAS page (if any)

Does my UROP Supervisor need to take note of additional roles?

- No additional roles for supervisors if students decide to upgrade to UROP+REx
- Supervisors are only required to endorse application and reimbursement forms, and provide guidance of relevant matters where needed (proposed budget breakdown, suggested formats for research showcase)

As part of the programme's objective to encourage students to explore further scope of their research, REx Fellows are **not allowed** to double count their UROP report/presentation to fulfill research showcase component.
